The Wisdom of God cries aloud: The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. **Dear Friends,**

Trinity Sunday celebrates the three distinct Persons in the one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We adore one God. Jesus Christ revealed the Trinitarian nature of God. He spoke of God as His Father, even calling God "Abba" or "Daddy". Jesus, also spoke of the Holy Spirit whom God the Father would send after He was gone.



The Nicene Creed which Catholics profess each Sunday at Mass states, "I believe in one God, **the Father** the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. ... I believe in one Lord, **Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God**, born of the Father before all ages... begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven... I believe in **the Holy Spirit**, the Lord the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets."

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity requires our humble submission of will in faith since it is beyond human understanding. In the presence of the one God, we are in the presence of our Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier: Father Son and Holy Spirit.

The word, 'consubstantial' in the Nicene Creed expresses the Church's faith in the oneness of the three Persons (See 'The Catechism of the Catholic Church' Nos. 242 & 251).

The Eucharistic Preface during the Mass summarises our faith as we pray to the Trinity saying, "(Holy Father) For with your Only Begotten Son and the Holy Spirit, you are one God, one Lord: not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance. For what you have revealed to us of your glory we believe equally of your Son and of the Holy Spirit, so that, in the confessing of the true and eternal Godhead, you might be adored in what is proper to each Person, their unity in substance, and their equality in majesty."

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells the story of a Father who shares everything with the Son and sends Him into the world and the Spirit of truth who will come to complete the work of the Son, Jesus. The Spirit will continue to make Jesus present in our world and will make this truth ever clearer to us, until that day when we will be finally led into its fullness.

May the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for all.
