At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'

Let us not lose sight of Jesus, who leads us in our faith and brings it to perfection: for the sake of the joy which was still in the future, he endured the cross, disregarding the shamefulness of it, and from now on has taken his place at the right of God's throne. Think of the way he stood such opposition from sinners and then you will not give up for want of courage. In the fight against sin, you have not yet had to keep fighting to the point of death.

Dear Friends,

The Gospel passage today is pointing us to Jesus' mission to suffer death on a cross. We are presented with a few sayings of Jesus: "I have come to bring fire to the earth."

"There is a baptism I must still receive."

" I am not here to bring peace but division."

How are we to make sense of these sayings taken from Luke's Gospel? As Jesus journeys from Galilee to Jerusalem He wants to prepare His followers for the scandalous event of His death on the Cross and the His sending of the Holy Spirit in the form of tongues of fire at Pentecost. Jesus knows that, that fire burns and will continue to burn through out the ages. It will be the strength of the weak, the light of the church's journey in this world as His followers become witnesses and proclaimers of the Gospel. But this message, and witness will be the cause of personal struggle and persecution. Jesus says that those who belong to Him will at times find themselves like lambs among wolves. Sometimes the wolves are the persons closest to us. It happened to Jesus Himself—He was betrayed by Judas. The images of fire and baptism clearly refer to Jesus' Passion presented as fire that consumes and like an immersion in the waters of baptism and in the deep waters of suffering and death. Jesus expresses His deep desire to complete His mission of salvation that is brought about by the Cross and to see this salvation extend to all people like a large fire fanned by the Holy Spirit. Jesus is the cause of division in the sense that He presents all people with a radical choice in their lives: there are those who accept Jesus and there are others who reject Him. This choice will seriously affect all our relationships including family and friends.
