

First Reading Ex 32:7-11. 13-14

A reading from the book of Exodus
The Lord spoke to Moses, 'Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostatised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. "Here is your God, Israel," they have cried, "who brought you up from the land of Egypt!" I can see how headstrong these people are! Leave me, now, my wrath shall blaze out against them and devour them; of you, however, I will make a great nation. 'But Moses pleaded with the Lord his God. 'Lord,' he said, 'why should your wrath blaze out against this people of yours whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with arm outstretched and mighty hand? Remember Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, your servants to whom by your own self you swore and made this promise: I will make your offspring as many as the stars of heaven, and all this land which I promised I will give to your descendants, and it shall be their heritage for ever.' So the Lord relented and did not bring on his people the disaster he had threatened.

I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength, and who judged me faithful enough to call me into his service even though I used to be a blasphemer and did all I could to injure and discredit the faith. Mercy, however, was shown me, because until I became a believer I had been acting in ignorance; and the grace of our Lord filled me with faith and with the love that is in Christ Jesus. Here is a saying that you can rely on and nobody should doubt: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. I myself am the greatest of them; and if mercy has been shown to me, it is because Jesus Christ meant to make me the greatest evidence of his inexhaustible patience for all the other people who would later have to trust in him to come to eternal life. To the eternal King, the undying, invisible and only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Alleluia, alleluia! God was in Christ, to reconcile the world to himself; and the Good News of reconciliation he has entrusted to us. Alleluia!

Gospel Lk 15:1-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke
The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them: 'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance. 'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'

Dear Friends,

In the Gospel today, Jesus puts before us three stories: the story of the shepherd who leaves all his other ninety-nine sheep to look for the lost one; the story of the widow who goes to great lengths to search for a lost coin; and finally the story of a father who welcomes back a son who cuts all ties with family and friends and leaves for a distant country. These stories speak of a God who is overjoyed when he finds what is lost, and they also speak about the great love of God the Father. In all three readings the Gospel message is the same: God the Father loves all people through Jesus Christ His Son and God forgives all our failures. In other words, the Gospel today speaks of God's great mercy.

Jesus not only welcomes sinners but befriends them; He even has meals with them. The religious leaders criticised Jesus for this because no good Jew was allowed to mix with sinners. To associate with sinners would prevent them from worshiping in the Temple of Jerusalem. But Jesus tells these stories to point out that the religious leaders are the sinners because they do not accept Jesus' message. All those who do accept Jesus will experience God's great mercy. God's mercy is for all. If the religious leaders accept Jesus, they too will share in God's love and forgiveness. We might ask ourselves: Is there anyone who has no need of God's mercy and forgiveness? May we be like God the Father who is merciful and forgiving and may we reach out to those who are far from God's mercy so that they too may share in the love and joy of God.

60th Anniversary of the arrival of the Dominican Sisters in Tasmania

"60 years ago the Dominican sisters arrived in Hobart to bring Catholic Education for girls to the Northern Suburbs. They founded St John's Primary and Holy Name Schools in Glenorchy and Holy Rosary School in Claremont. Years later they co-founded Dominic College and then Guilford Young College. Throughout these years they became and continue to be an integral presence in St John's Catholic Parish in Glenorchy."

This anniversary is celebrated with a special Mass today September 15th here at St John the Baptist, Glenorchy. We extend our humble thanks to all Dominican Sisters for their faithful service and pray for God's blessing on them now and always.
