Dear Friends,

The human heart desires joy. Everyone desires to have joy; every family and every people seek happiness. But what kind of joy is the Christian called to live and give witness to? It is that which comes from being close to God and of His presence in our lives. From the time of Jesus' entry into our human history by His birth at Bethlehem, the human race has received the seed of the Kingdom of God, like the soil that receives the seed with the promise of a future harvest. There is no need to look elsewhere! Jesus has come to bring joy to all, now and always. We are not speaking of a hoped for joy in the future or a joy which we will experience in paradise: as if to say that here on earth we are sad and in heaven we will be happy. No! It is not like this. We can experience even now a real joy because Jesus Himself is our joy and with Jesus, joy is like the security and the love we may experience in our family where we can be ourselves and be appreciated and affirmed without fear or judgement. Jesus is alive! He is the Risen One and He is present among us especially through God's Word and the Church's Sacraments.

Pope Francis has just written a wonderful Apostolic Letter "On the Meaning and importance of the Nativity Scene" (1/12/19)(You may pick up a copy at the back of the Church). He writes, "I wish to

encourage the beautiful tradition of preparing the nativity scene in the days before Christmas, but also the custom of setting it up in the workplace, in schools, hospitals, prisons and town squares. ... Why does the Christmas creche (crib) arouse such wonder and move us so deeply? First, because it shows God's tender love: the Creator of the universe lowered himself to



take up our littleness. The gift of life, in all its mystery, becomes all the more wondrous as we realise that the Son of Mary is the source and sustenance of all life. In Jesus, the Father has given us a brother who comes to seek us out whenever we are confused or lost, a loyal friend ever at our side. He gave us his Son who forgives us and frees us from our sins."
