Dear Friends,

The First Reading from the Book of Leviticus began with God's call to the Jewish people to "be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy." At the end of today's Gospel passage Jesus concludes with the words: "You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect." The Church reminds us that this call to holiness is the most important duty of a Christian. All those who have been baptised are called to holiness: priests, religious, lay people, married people, young and old. Whatever walk of life you may find yourself in, all should try to reach this goal. Holiness is not about working miracles or in doing extraordinary things. It is the commitment which we prayed for at the beginning of Mass when we said: " Help us to be like Jesus in word and deed." This commitment is nothing other than the commandment to love the Lord your God with all your heart and your neighbour as yourself. Love of God is real when we show it by the love we have for other. The more we love God, the more we will love others. We cannot say we love God if we do not love our neighbour.

Pastoral Notes:

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on 26 February. It is a day of Fasting and abstinence. Holy Mass at St John's at 9.00am and 7.00pm with the distribution of ashes. Fasting means having only one full meal on a day. Smaller quantities of food may be eaten at two other meals but no food should be consumed at any other time during the day. Abstinence is the practice of abstaining from the use of certain kinds of food. Catholics were once well known for their practice of abstaining from meat on Fridays. We should abstain from meat at least on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The minimum fasting requirements make most sense when they are combined with prayer and almsgiving. These age-old disciplines reflect our fundamental concerns: our relationship with God (prayer), with our bodies (fasting) and with others (almsgiving).


