distinct Persons who share the one nature. The Eucharistic Prayer at Mass states, " (Father) For with your only Begotten Son and the Holy Spirit you are one God, one Lord: not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance." It is a mystery



which has been revealed to us by Jesus. We must accept it in faith because it is beyond human understanding. What is essential for Christians is to know that we have a God who is Father and Creator of all that exists, a Son who saves the world and a Holy Spirit who helps people to live with faith, hope and love.
