Dear Friends,


God's ways are not our ways. God is always fair and right. God's justice is His infinite and unconditional love for each person.

In the story about the landowner Jesus points out that for God all people are His friends. The landowner does not treat his workers like slaves. He treats them like friends.

Also, the reason why Jesus tells this story is because the Jews and especially the religious leaders at that time considered themselves the privileged people of God and they believed that all others: the poor, the pagans and the public sinners etc... as excluded from God's love and mercy. Jesus does not dispute their privileged position before God but He extends this privilege to all. What is important is to understand that God's salvation is for all and that we are all called to be friends, and friends of God.

When the one who worked the longest complained to him about his wages the landowner said to him: "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?"

Jesus treats each person as a friend. It is this friendship based on love and generosity that Jesus is



asking us to accept. We must not judge others by what they do or fail to do. We must treat others with generosity and respect because that is the way God treats all.

Jesus wants to point out that no one is "better" than anyone else before God. We all stand empty handed, sinful and in need of God's mercy and forgiveness. God accepts everyone in His kingdom. The poor, the needy, those rejected by society also have a place and are welcomed. God does not exclude anyone, rich or poor. Why should we be jealous because God is so generous towards
