### Dear Friends,

The Pharisees and the Herodians (a group within Jewish society who cooperated with the Roman authorities) approached Jesus to discredit Him. They asked if it was permissible to pay taxes to the Roman Emperor or not. This was a problem for the Jews: if they acknowledged the sovereignty of Rome by paying taxes to them using money bearing the figure of the pagan emperor, they would be practically putting Caesar above God, their true King. On the other hand, if they failed to pay their taxes to Rome they would be punished by the Roman overlords.

But Jesus uncovers the malice and insincerity of the Pharisees and Herodians. He replies, "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." Therefore, for Jesus, it is not a question of "either or", but, "both and". That is, "You use the money belonging to Caesar for your commerce; you receive benefits from Caesar, render to him what is his due, but give to God what belongs to God, that is, acknowledge also your duties to God,...".

For us today, Jesus reminds us not to confuse material things and those of the spirit. Our priority is what is spiritual, that is, our duties to God. But we should not neglect our duties to lawful authorities.

Don Bosco, the Founder of the Salesian Family in the Church, worked tirelessly to lead the young, especially those who were poorer, to Christ. His only concern was to help them to become good Christians and honest members of society.

May Don Bosco, through the motherly intercession of the Virgin Mary Mother of God, obtain for all Christians a greater love for Jesus and His Church and the commitment to spread His kingdom of peace in the world through works of charity towards all, especially the needy. (Fr Guy)


