The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."

Gospel Mt 13:24-43-Continuing

He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all the seeds. but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all and becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come and shelter in its branches.' He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through.' In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed, he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfill the prophecy: I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world. Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, 'Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us.' He said in reply, 'The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one; the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his kingdom all things that provoke offences and all who do evil, and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will

shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears!'.

Dear Friends,

There is a similarity between the parable of the Sower, from last Sunday's Gospel, and the parable about the good seed and the bad wheat (darnel), in today's Gospel. In both parables there is a sower, there is a field in which it is sown, there is even the devil or the evil one, who in last Sunday's Gospel, "comes and carries off what was sown in the heart" of the distracted listener, and in this week's Gospel "sowed darnel all among the wheat." However, the purpose of each parable is different. In today's Gospel parable what matters is not the apparent success of the evil seed over the good seed but Christ's final judgement on those whose actions in this life have been evil. At the end, the good people will be separated from the bad people. It is this final judgement which, gives us hope even though the spread of the darnel threatens the small harvest. In any case, the farmer continues to care for it. Therefore, it is fortunate for humanity that Christ, the Judge is merciful and forgiving. May the Virgin Mary, Mother of God pray to Jesus for all. (Fr. Guy)
