'Have you understood all this?' They said, 'Yes.' And he said to them, 'Well, then, every scribe who becomes a disciple of the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who brings out from his storeroom things both new and old.'

Dear Friends,

The Gospel today is about an essential aspect of our faith: the Kingdom of Heaven. It is worth risking everything to gain it. If we lose the Kingdom of Heaven then we have lost everything.

But what is this Kingdom of Heaven that Jesus talks about? In simple words, it is another way of saying that we are all children of God. It means that we belong to Him and that our true happiness is not in the riches of this world but in our friendship with God. It means to know that God loves us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus to die for us and for all people. Therefore, for Christians, the meaning of life is not to get rich or to be famous and powerful. It is to live as children of God. All are called to have a close friendship with Him. It is this friendship that is our real treasure. This does not mean we need to give up all other things. But, what we must do is to put God first in our lives above all else. However, sometimes we put other things before God and we may forget who we are and where we are going.

In today's Gospel Jesus uses common examples to help people understand what the Kingdom of Heaven is like. The two stories of the treasure hidden in a field and the pearl of great value both teach us a great truth of our faith: we need courage to risk everything to obtain this one treasure. But once we have discovered it in our lives we must make a choice: either to accept it or to reject it. Do we risk everything to keep our friendship with Jesus, no matter what?

Once there was a teacher who wanted to become the principal of his school. He worked very hard and put in

his best hours and his best efforts into it. He had very little time to spend with his family and even less time to waste with his friends. Everyone knew where his treasure was.

But then he had a heart attack. He was taken to hospital where he lay for days not knowing whether he would live or die. During this time in hospital his wife and children visited him every day and spent long hours by his bedside. All the time he prayed with all his heart: 'Lord give me back my life, and I'll be happy.' And he made up his mind that if he got well, he would change his life.

He made a full recovery. The day he walked out of hospital he was very happy. Everything had been given back to him. Through that painful experience he learned much. Before his sickness he was only thinking of himself and his job. Now he decided to live for others and to work for them. And he was happier than he had ever been in his life.

What about us, what is our treasure in life? Are we growing in our friendship with God? May we pray for the wisdom and courage to live well as children of God and work for the good of others. May the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for all.
