
Gospel Acclamation Mk 1:15 Alleluia, alleluia! The kingdom of God is near: believe the Good News! Alleluia!

Dear Friends,

In **the Gospel** Reading today, Jesus begins his public ministry by proclaiming: **'The time has come and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News'**. His hearers are warned to turn back to God and to believe in the words and actions of Jesus because from now on it is He who reveals God the Father to the world. Through His words and actions, and His death and resurrection, Jesus brings God's salvation to all humankind.

Therefore, people are urgently called to examine their lives and make or renew their heartfelt commitment to accept Jesus, follow Him more closely and live by Gospel values. Simon, Andrew, James and John, the first four disciples of Jesus are examples for us to imitate because they heard the urgent call to repent and believe in Jesus, responded promptly and wholeheartedly and followed Him.

In the Gospel, Jesus says, "The time has come". This refers to God's time of salvation which He accomplishes in His own time. With Jesus, God's time has come. Jesus makes known God the Father and therefore, now is the time to respond to His call and follow Him. If we place our trust in Jesus we are saved. Failing to decide to follow Jesus and live by His teaching will be our ruin.

When Jesus says, "The kingdom of God is at hand", He is referring to Himself. By His Incarnation, words, actions, death and resurrection He is preparing for His final coming when He will present all people and all creation to God for their eternal happiness with God.

Finally, Jesus says, "Repent and believe the Good News." But to enter the kingdom of God is not easy, nevertheless, it is possible. Entry into God's kingdom is now through faith in Jesus and by living in a Christ-like manner in this life. For Jesus those who are blessed are the poor, those who mourn, the persecuted, those who hunger for justice, the peacemakers, the gentle, the merciful, the pure in heart... for theirs is the kingdom of God. To "believe in the Gospel" means a whole-hearted trust in Jesus and living life by the Gospel values. May the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for us so that we may be more Christ-like, always put our trust in Him and lead others to know and follow Him too.

St Francis de Sales

Today we also celebrate the Memoria of St Francis de Sales, one of the main patrons of the Salesians. Our founder, Don Bosco, wanted us to be like St Francis because he was so gentle and mild towards all. Pope St John XXIII wrote in his personal diary, 'My life, so the Lord tells me, must be a perfect copy of that of St Francis if I wish to bear good fruit. Nothing extraordinary in me, or in my behaviour, except my way of doing ordinary things. "All ordinary things but done in no ordinary way." A great burning love for Jesus Christ and his Church, unalterable serenity of mind, wonderful gentleness with everyone, that is all.' (Fr Guy)


