A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean". As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp.'

Gospel Mk 1:40-45

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' he said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

Dear Friends,

The Gospel today is about God's loving presence among us. It is God who heals all our sicknesses. God is always ready to listen and to heal those who pray to Him with faith.

In today's Gospel story, Jesus heals a leper. He allows the leper to approach Him. He listens to his prayer, takes pity on him and stretches out his hand and cures him with a word. Jesus says, to the leper, "Of course I want to! Be cured!"

The point of the story is that Jesus is not just a miracle worker who can heal us of any sickness. Jesus is above all the Suffering Servant of God who suffered and died on the cross in obedience to God the Father's will. The miracles Jesus works only make sense if we accept Jesus as our crucified Saviour.

The leper represents humanity separated from God because of sin. It is Jesus who comes close to us, has pity on us, touches us, heals us and saves us so that we may live in peace with one another and with God. By healing us and taking away our sins, Jesus takes on Himself our sins and diseases on the Cross. He heals us by the blood of the Cross and by His resurrection saves us from sin and death. Indeed God does wonders for His faithful people. God grants those who believe in Him eternal life through His Son Jesus.

An American priest, Fr George Mckenna, tells the story of a marine fighter pilot who was shot down by a ground to air missile in the Vietnam War. "As this pilot threw himself down on the frozen dirt floor, darkness and despair filled his heart. As a (Christian), he knew he couldn't survive the cold, the heat, the poor food, the frequent torture sessions, without God's help. What could he do to bring God's presence into his cell in some visible way? What would (the reader) I do in this situation? After some thought the pilot took off his military shoe and, with the leather heal, scraped a cross on the cement wall. Through the months and years ahead, he made this his place of prayer, with his thoughts usually centred on the Cross of Christ, "Christ came to show me how to live," this man of faith kept saving to himself. "In the garden of Gethsemane, the Lord accepted His cup of suffering from the Father when He said, "Not my will but vours be done."

Each day, the American pilot, accepted the hardships of prison life and offered his pain-filled hours to the Father in union with the passion of Christ on the Cross. A few years later he left the prison, strong in spirit and deeply in love with life.

May the Virgin Mary, Mother of God and St Joseph, Her virginal spouse, pray to Jesus for all people.
