
### Gospel Jn 10:11-18

Jesus said:

'I am the good shepherd:

# Dear Friends,

Jesus says: 'I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.' Jesus reminds us that He is the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The only reason He is the Good Shepherd is because He lays down His life for His sheep in obedience to God's command. God the Father invites His Son to lay down His life not only for our salvation but for the salvation of the whole world. Jesus freely responded in love to the Father's call and accepted His suffering and death on the Cross.

Jesus says, "The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No-one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father." In other words, Jesus is talking about His suffering and death on the Cross. On the Cross, we see even more clearly the selfless gift of Christ's love. No-one has the power to take Jesus' life; not Pilate, not the Jews, not anyone else. Jesus, himself lays down His life freely as a gift to all people and to His heavenly Father. The greatness of this total gift depends on Jesus' power to take it up

again. This taking up again refers to Jesus' resurrection. It is the resurrection which makes Christ the only Good Shepherd. The resurrection makes Him Saviour of the world.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday when we pray for vocations to the priestly life, I would urge you to thank God for your own vocation, be it marriage, priesthood, Religious life or the single life. Please encourage each other to follow Jesus more closely and build a deep relationship with Him. God may be calling some of you to the priestly or religious life. Prav for the courage to listen to God's call in your life. Jesus says, "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest (Lk 10.2).

Also on this Anzac Day let us not forget the great sacrifices our military people have made for the preservation of peace and security in our part of the world and beyond. God has blessed us with peace and harmony may we always work to extend God's blessings to all people of good will. Let us also remember especially the people of Myanmar who have lost their democratic freedom and peace. May the military leaders return the government of the country to its elected people. Fr Guy
