As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him. knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up.' he said, 'I am only a man after all!' Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.' While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ, Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

Second Reading 1 Jn 4:7-10

My dear people, let us love one another since love comes from God and everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Anyone who fails to love can never have known God, because God is love. God's love for us was revealed when God sent into the world his only Son so that we could have life through him; this is the love I mean: not our love for God, but God's love for us when he sent his Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away.

Gospel Acclamation Jn 14:23 Alleluia, alleluia!

All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them.

Gospel Jn 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me,

so I have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments vou will remain in my love, iust as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if you do what I command you, I shall not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business: I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. You did not choose me, no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last: and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name. What I command you is to love one another.'



It is an unconditional love; it is a love that suffers all, even to the point of death because when we truly love someone, we are willing to die for that person.

George McKenna, American priest, tells this story that may help us to put Jesus words: "love one another as I have loved you," into practice in our daily lives. "Recently, at a morning parish Mass with school children in attendance, I told the boys and girls, "See the Lord as an infant in arms. Really our Saviour has no age. Carry Him about in your arms as you do vour little brothers and sisters. Talk to Him about vour secret fears and worries. Especially hug Him tightly and tell the Holy Child your love." Many weeks later, the school secretary told me how much she enjoyed the idea and how she had done this in her own prayer life with much profit to her happiness. Why can't we do the same? Are not we adults, children at heart?

Our (Lord Jesus) as an Infant, is no different than our Saviour on the Cross. Find much joy in holding the Christ Child close in your arms, so innocent and helpless. In this cold world, He wants our hugs and tenderness. How quickly the Child of Mary would win over our hearts and help us (bring) love and peace in our homes. ...We can bring God's (love and) peace in our words like: "Have I told you today how much I love you? I love you more than I can say. Thanks for all the good things you do for us."

The great Carmelite spiritual writer, St John of the Cross said: "Have a great love for those who contradict you and do not love you, because in this way love is produced in the heart where it does not exist; do as God does with us, who loves us so that we may love Him through the love that He brings us."

St Dorotheus of Gaza who lived in the 6th Century, wrote: "Try to love one another because our union with God depends on our union to one another. I want to give you an example: imagine that this circle represents the world and at the centre of the circle is God. The lines which go from the outer edge of the circle to the centre represent our individual paths to God. The saints strive to get closer and closer to God but by doing so they are getting closer and closer to everyone else. (Fr. Guy)
