Dear Friends,

St. John the Baptist

As we walk with Jesus through His public ministry during the period of Ordinary Time, we find ourselves on the western shore of the Sea of Galilee. Jesus has just completed His teaching of the parable of the mustard seed. What we will hear today is the first of three miraculous actions: 1) The stilling of the storm (Mark 4:35-40), 2) Exorcizing a demon (Mark 5:1-20), and 3) Healing the sick (Mark 5:21-43).

"When you have to listen to abuse, that means you are being buffeted by the wind. When your anger is roused, you are being tossed by the waves. So, when the winds blow and the waves mount high, the boat is in danger, your heart is imperilled, your heart is taking a battering. On hearing vourself insulted, you long to retaliate; but the joy of revenge brings with it another kind of misfortune - shipwreck. Why this? Because Christ is asleep in vou. What do I mean? I mean vou have forgotten His presence. Rouse Him, then; remember Him, let Him keep watch within you, pay heed to Him. ... A temptation arises: it is the wind. It disturbs you: it is the surging of the sea. This is the moment to awaken Christ and let Him remind you of those words: 'Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?" [Saint Augustine of Hippo (between A.D. 391-430), Sermons, 63,1-3]

Therefore, what we need is faith. A simple but deep faith convinced that the only important thing is to be united to Jesus "who died for all" as St Paul reminds us in our Second Reading (2 Cor 5:14-17). A faith that becomes trust and child-like surrender in God the Father and a calm acceptance of His divine will. A faith based on humility and recognising that we are small, poor, limited and fragile; that pride and selfsufficiency cannot help us.

May the Lord grant us a deep simple faith in His Son Jesus and may the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for us always.

"One night a man had a dream. He dreamed he was walking along the beach with the Lord. Across the sky flashed scenes from his life. For each scene, he noticed two sets of footprints in the sand; one belonging to him, and the other to the Lord.

When the last scene of his life flashed before him, he looked back at the footprints in the sand. He noticed that many times along the path of his life there was only one set of footprints. He also noticed that it happened at the very lowest and saddest times in his

This really bothered him and he guestioned the Lord about it. "Lord, you said that once I decided to follow you, you'd walk with me all the way. But I have noticed that during the most troublesome times in my life, there is only one set of footprints. I don't understand why when I needed you most you would leave me.

The Lord replied, 'My son, my precious child, I love you and would never leave you. During your times of trial and suffering, When you see only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you." Fr Guy
