Dear Friends,

The Gospel passage today is taken from chapter 13 of Mark's Gospel. Here, Jesus speaks about the destruction of Jerusalem and the coming of the end of the world. The Gospel reminds us that we have no permanent city here on earth and there will be an end to human history. One day, the world as we know it will pass away forever.

In the meantime, Christians should live in the joy of God's presence among them through the practice of the Gospel values as lived out by Jesus, the image of the unseen God. They should be ready and watch for that Day in a spirit of faith and trust in Him. What will prepare them for Jesus' final coming at the end of time are their acts of charity and the good use of their time and talents. They will be judged on their joyful service of others, especially the needy, and their love for God.

When I was very young, my mother told me two savings that she, herself, had learnt as a child: firstly, in hell there is a very large clock with two hands: on one hand the words, "Always, always" are printed in large letters and on the other hand, the words, "Never, never". Then she explained the meaning of those words: those who go to hell will remain there always and they will never get out. Secondly, heaven is like a big chocolate factory where you can eat as much chocolate as you want. As a child, to me, chocolate was like heaven. In this way, my mother helped me to understand that heaven was the place where I wanted to go.

Today, let our prayer be, "may your help, O Lord, make us joyful in your service, for only in serving you, source of all that is good, can we have true happiness." And may the Virgin Mary Mother of God assist and protect us on our earthly pilgrimage towards heaven.
