Last Wednesday the whole of Australia was filled with joy when the news broke out that the Western Australian Police Force had found Cloe Smith, a four-year-old girl who went missing eighteen days before in Carnarvon, Western Australia. Jesus invites His followers to thank God every day for what they have and to be generous towards others.
