Gospel Mk 10:35-45

They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

Dear Friends,

This passage from St Mark's Gospel is part of a discipleship section. Mark is writing to people who love the high life. He presents the Gospel as discipleship where denial of self, service and suffering are integral.

"For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Jesus is presented as the Suffering Servant who gives himself utterly and so wins life for others. The Gospel makes it clear that this is the pattern for his followers as well.

Although his disciples are slow to understand Jesus, they nevertheless continue to follow him. Their relationship is far from perfect but it is also unbroken. What does it mean for us? Discipleship will mean more trouble not less. True discipleship is characterised by a costly pouring out

of one's life for other people in countless little ways, for example, living in community, caring for an aged confrere or any other person whose situation demands neighbourly service at personal cost.

St Therese of the Child Jesus writes, "When I speak of a mortified life, I do not mean to allude to the great penances of the great saints. Far from resembling those beautiful souls who from their very infancy practiced every form of mortification... I make my penances "consist only of denying and mortifying my will, in withholding a word of harsh reply, in rendering to those around me little services without letting them be noticed, and a thousand other little things of this kind." (Valentino Del Mazza SDB 252.1 Maz)

May the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for us.
