In today's Gospel passage, St Luke writes, "Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days." The temptations are for Jesus a radical test of His relationship with God the Father. Through His trust in God's goodness and mercy and in the light of the Scriptures He is able to overcome the devil.

Christians of all times are tempted in the same way as Jesus was. But while Jesus was always obedient to God the Father, Christians sometimes fail to put their trust in God. Jesus succeeded where we sometimes fail because Jesus lived according to the Scriptures. It is the Scriptures and the commitment to follow Jesus more closely that will help us always to be obedient to the Lord.

Lent is a special time to listen to the Word of God in the Scriptures and allow God to speak to us and transform us. May the Virgin Mary Mother of God, who was always faithful to God, help us and pray for us to Her Son, Jesus.

The war unfolding between Russia and the Ukraine is a tragedy for humanity and a crucial reminder of the need for all people to work for peace in our world. We pray through the intercession of Mary, Queen of Peace for a peaceful resolution to the conflict between Russia and Ukraine and that all nations will be spared the catastrophe of a worldwide war.
