Gospel Acclamation See Lk 8:15 Alleluia, alleluia! Happy are they who have kept the word with a generous heart and yield a harvest through perseverance.



St. John the Baptist

Today's story about Martha and Mary takes place as Jesus travels from Galilee to Jerusalem. What awaits Him in Jerusalem is persecution, suffering, and death on a cross.

During the journey, Jesus sends out His disciples ahead of Him to do what He does: cure the sick, cast out devils and proclaim God's love for all. Along the way, Jesus takes a well-earned rest at the home of Martha and Marv.

The point of the story is to challenge all would be believers to become listeners of God's Word and to motivate them to love Jesus and continue His mission in the world. It is not enough to come to the aid of those in need, for example, like the Good Samaritan or Mary and Martha who welcome and attend to the needs of Jesus. To be a disciple of Jesus also involves listening to Him and being guided by His Gospel.

The two sisters, Martha and Mary, represent two different ways of serving God. They are not opposites but they complement each other. They are both equally important. Martha is not wrong because she is busy making Jesus feel welcome and preparing a tasty meal. She gets it wrong because she is distracted with all the serving. Jesus says, "Martha, Martha, you worry and fret about so many things and yet few are needed, indeed only one." In worrying about all the things to be done, she overlooks the Person who is



the reason for all her service - Jesus, This is the danger people who put all their energy in doing good things for others may fall into.

Think about Martha's desire for Mary to join her in the kitchen and Mary's and Jesus' quiet decision not to let Martha's complaint bother them. Jesus seemed content to let Martha be Martha and Mary be Mary; he seemed to understand that each of them was showing love and hospitality in her own way. Do you see both Martha and Mary in yourself? How are you balancing both aspects of loving God and others? Do you sometimes judge others and expect them to think and act according to your ways? Can you respect them as they are and as they express their "love language"? Pray for the grace of being accepting and nonjudgmental toward others as the Lord is with us.

May the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for us as we try to love others as Jesus loves us. (Fr Guy)
