St. John the Baptist

The theme of Today's Gospel is prayer. It is Jesus who shows and teaches us how to pray.

Parish Website:

In prayer we approach God as our loving "Father" and even like an innocent child who is full of trust, obedience and love.

For Jesus, praver is not about handing over the problems that overwhelm us so that He may fix them for us. On the contrary, through prayer we commit ourselves to discover what God wants from us so that we may put it into practice in our lives, day by day, with the strength and the courage that He will not fail to give us.

In the Our Father, Jesus wants to teach us HOW to pray and WHAT TO ASK FOR in praver.

Jesus, teaches us how to pray ... "say this when you pray: Father", that is, (Abba or) Daddy. This is the first word that the believer says when he/she places himself/herself in God's presence to pray. With this warm & tender word, a loving, joyful and close relationship grows with God the Father. He comes to us with His loving goodness and support. God loves each person just as He loves His own Son, Jesus, because we are disciples of Jesus, and we belong to Him and are united to Him. Therefore, in that word "Father=Daddy" that we say to God in prayer we are committing ourselves to love God with all our hearts just as Jesus did, His own Father.

Jesus also teaches us what to ask for from the Father. In the "Our Father" there are two types of prayer: the first type speaks directly of God (eq. 'Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come'). The second type of prayer is about our needs (give us.. forgive us...do not put us to the test). These two types of praver speak about our personal relationship with God and with others in the community. The person that prays is not alone or isolated before God but he/she is inseparable from the praver of the community. Therefore, the first part of the Our Father is centred on God the Father and the second part, on us as part of the faithful community with our spiritual and material needs.

How do I recite the Our Father... in a hurry? Do I reflect on what I am saying? Do I put this prayer into practice in my life? The best gift we could ask God for is the one that Jesus mentioned in today's reading: the gift of the Holv Spirit.

May the Virgin Mary Mother of God and Spouse of the Holy Spirit intercede with the Holy Spirit to dwell with us always. (Fr Guy)
