Gospel—Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, so sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.' The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, "I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.

Dear Friends,

On His way to Jerusalem where He will suffer, die and rise again, Jesus commissions 72 disciples and sends them out ahead of Him to preach the Kingdom of God and to heal the sick. God's message of salvation is for all and must reach the ends of the earth.

For the disciples to be credible witnesses of Jesus' message of salvation, they should be people of prayer since only God is the Lord of the harvest and only God can raise up disciples who will preach the Gospel and be true disciples. Jesus said to them, "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to His harvest." (10:2) The image of the harvest speaks to us of God's imminent judgement of the world. When the disciples go out on mission they are to proclaim, "The Kingdom of God is very near to you." (10:9) Jesus shares His mission with the disciples. This means that their preaching forces the listeners to make a decision to follow Jesus or to reject Him. May the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for us.
