For example, if we imagine God to be a severe judge, then we will live in the fear of being punished and rejected for our failures or bad actions. It may even make us too submissive or passive.

An image of God as boss or master was, and still is being used to justify people's positions of power and domination in society, in the Church and in the family.

For many people, at the time of Jesus, was distant, severe and judgemental. God was Someone who threatened them with punishment. But, Jesus revealed a new image of God. The joy of the shepherd and the widow who have found what they have lost shows us God's infinite joy over one repentant sinner who returns to God.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the usual way we receive God's forgiveness. It is the best way to regain peace of heart and mind. May we never doubt God's infinite mercy and love for each one of us. And may the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for all people of good will.
