
## Dear friends,

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches us to beware of riches. The parable of the rich man and the poor Lazarus is about the danger of riches to our eternal salvation. God condemns the rich man to an unhappy eternity away from God's love. But He rewards Lazarus with eternal happiness in His loving embrace.

The rich man is not condemned because he is rich but because he does not use his riches for the good of others. especially Lazarus, at his door. He is condemned because selfishness has blinded him to the needs of others. Lazarus is not saved because he is poor and needy, but because he puts his trust in God and is not attached to the things of this world.

Riches are not evil. But the failure to share them with others, especially the poor is sinful because it allows some to live in excessive luxury while others die in misery and poverty. Furthermore, the poor are not saved simply because they are poor but because they rely on God and allow God's love and goodness to guide their actions. If those who are poor become greedy and iealous of the rich they too will be excluded from the love of God.

The rich man who thought that his riches were a sign of God's blessing but who does nothing for the needy, in this life, finds himself in torment, far from the love of God in the afterlife. Lazarus, who thought himself to be guilty and punished by God, in this life, is warmly welcomed by God in the afterlife. Therefore, riches, or the things in this world, are not a sign of God's favour, neither is poverty a sign of God's punishment. God's judgement is impartial. He treats everyone with love and mercy. God does not favour one or the other. God wants us to show mercy and love to one another, including our enemies. If we are Christ-like in this life, then we will be pleasing to God. May Mary Help of Christians whom we commemorate on the 24th of each month, the Virgin Mary, Mother of God pray to Jesus for all.
