On this fifth Sunday of Lent, Jesus says:

"I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"


The Gospel today is about faith in Jesus, Jesus of Nazareth raises His close friend, Lazarus, from the dead because of Martha's act of faith in Jesus. She says, 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the One who was to come into this world.'

St John, the Gospel writer, ends his Gospel with the words: 'Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what Jesus did believed in Him'. Do I believe that Jesus is the resurrection and the life? Do I believe that Jesus will raise my body from the dead and share His eternal life - body and soul - in heaven at the end of time?

When we experience setbacks and tragedies in our lives it may seem that God is absent. We may come close to losing our faith and may even give in to despair. But our unwavering faith in Jesus, no matter what, can help and console us in our suffering and loss.

Jesus understands the sorrow. the emptiness and the confusion caused by death. He went through it Himself: He died on the Cross. By His death and resurrection. He shows us that just as He rose again, we too will one day overcome death, not by avoiding it but by going through it ourselves and rising above it.

His own death and resurrection. Jesus opened for us the doors to eternal life. Therefore, He is our sure hope of resurrection and eternal life. By raising Lazarus from the dead, He offers us the hope of a bright new world, if we put our trust in Him. May our prayer be: "Jesus I trust in You!" May the Virgin Mary Mother of God and St Joseph Her Spouse pray to Jesus for us.
