Dear Friends,

The Emmaus story in the Gospel today can help us to make sense of our lives and it may renew our faith and trust in Jesus, our loving and merciful Lord and Saviour.

He joins the two travellers and walks with them as they return from Jerusalem to their hometown, Emmaus, about 11 kilometres away, sad and dejected. They have left their community in grief and disbelief. They think that all is over with Jesus' death on the Cross. But on the road, Jesus gently reawakens their faith by inviting them to share their story and by explaining to them the Scriptures concerning Himself. As night falls, the two travellers press Him to stay with them a little longer. It is only at the 'breaking of the bread' that their eyes of faith are opened and they recognise the Risen Lord! They can no longer contain their joy. In the dark of night, they rush back to Jerusalem to tell their community what had happened. "Jesus is alive!" They shouted, "We saw Him!"

The Emmaus story shows the goodness of God. We need not be sad or despondent, but we can rejoice in the unpredictable events of our lives because Jesus journeys with us as He journeyed with the two disciples to Emmaus.

The Emmaus story is our story too. We may then discover that Jesus is alive and that He walks with us in good times and difficult times.



Even today someone tells me that he feels distant from God. There have been many disappointments and sad times in his life. He wishes he were more close to God, and that his life were happier than what he now feels. A young girl does not want to go to Mass with her family because it is boring for her. She does not feel its magic anymore. But the Emmaus story shows us that Jesus is alive to those who have the eves of faith. The risen Jesus is always with us especially when we share our life journey with those around us.

May we also walk with others, be present to them and listen to them. And may the Virgin Mary Mother of God who also walks with us help us meet Her Son Jesus especially when we listen to the Word of God and receive Him in the Eucharist (Fr Guv)
