Dear Friends,

Jesus' long farewell speech to His apostles, at the Last Supper, just before His passion and death on the Cross. This is to strengthen their faith and to comfort and reassure them before His departure.


Before leaving them, Jesus reveals Himself to His apostles to strengthen their faith and trust in Him. Christians should not be discouraged or despair, whatever happens to them in this world because Jesus and His Father are always with them through Their unconditional love for all people of good will. Therefore, Christians are called to place all their trust in Jesus, their Lord and Saviour.

The Gospel writer uses the questions he puts on the lips of Thomas and Philip to reveal Jesus' identity. To the question asked by Thomas, Jesus replies, "I am the way, the truth and the life." To Philip's question, Jesus replies, "I am in the Father and the Father is in me.' When Jesus says, "I am the way", He reveals His Father through His teaching and His miracles. What He says and does are true signs of God's presence in the world.

Therefore, those who put their The Gospel today is taken from trust in Jesus also put their trust in the God of Jesus Christ.

> Also, when Jesus says He is in the Father and the Father is in Him He means that He is one with God the Father because He always does the Father's will. It is the Father who acts directly through Him. Therefore, Jesus is the full revelation of the unseen God. Human beings cannot see God in any other way except through Jesus who reveals Him to the world.

> Christians are His disciples in so far as they imitate their Saviour and Lord. They too are called to do God the Father's will in their lives in response to Jesus' command to love one another. May the Virgin Mary Mother of God help us to be true disciples of Jesus.
