

# 2-3 September 2023, 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

# Dear Friends,

St John Bosco discovered God's plan for him gradually over time. He did not know God's will immediately. It grew out of his own experience of life. His vocation to work completely for the poor and abandoned youth took a long time to become a reality. But Don Bosco always put his trust in Jesus and His Mother Mary; he was guided by wise people around him; and the Holy Spirit enlightened him as he went ahead with faith and worked tirelessly to meet the material and spiritual needs of the very poor around him.

There came a time when his work among the poor and abandoned youth was growing very fast. With the help of many adult volunteers he was taking care of over one thousand boys who needed his help. But in 1848 the political climate of his country changed dramatically and nearly all his priest friends who were helping him in his work deserted him and they took many of the boys with them as well. This was a turning point in Don Bosco's life. He realised that he could not depend on them. From now on, he was on his own in his work for the poor and abandoned vouth.

Perhaps, a good way to describe this turning point in Don Bosco's life is the image of a street intersection. That is, a place where two roads meet. When we reach an intersection a decision must be made. We can either go straight

ahead through the intersection or turn left onto another road or turn right. Don Bosco could have turned left and given up on his dream to give his life to serve the young. He chose to continue on the hard and lonely road ahead of him with Jesus and Mary. Now there was no turning back. His life from now on would be dedicated totally to these young people who needed his help. For Don Bosco, to follow Jesus meant serving the young. This was now the work God had given him and all the Salesians who came after him.

The Gospel today also speaks of a crucial turning point in the life of Jesus and His disciples. Jesus can go straight ahead to Jerusalem where suffering and death await Him or can take Peter's advice to save His life and be a great leader of His people against the Roman army who control their land. But Jesus has made up His mind to do God's will and there is no turning back on this decision. He will not be talked out of it even though He knows that suffering and death await Him in Jerusalem.

Jesus reminds His disciples that He came to serve and lav down His life for all. He is our Brother who shares our joys and our fears, who died for us and who will always help us carry our crosses as we follow Him with courage and faith.

May the Virgin Mary Mother of God pray to Jesus for us.

# Tour of the Relic Statue of St John Bosco in Australia

The relic statue of St John Bosco, better known as Don Bosco, will be touring Australia as part of the celebrations of the centenary of the arrival of the Salesians on Australian soil. The Salesians came to the shore of Australia on 30th March 1923 in Fremantle, Western Australia.

The wax replica of the Saint contained in a glass casket comes from the Salesian Province of Hong Kong, made by Gianpiero Zoncu at the time of Don Bosco's beatification in 1929. A small bone from the right arm of the Saint was removed and placed in this wax replica before being securely concealed in the large glass casket.

John Bosco was born on 16 August 1815 in a farmhouse near a small village east of Turin in northern Italy. Since his childhood and as a mission from God, he had a desire to help the young people in need. He was ordained as a priest in Turin in 1841, at the age of 26 and dedicated his entire life for the good of the young to become 'good Christians and upright citizens'. Following his untiring life with the young, Don Bosco died on 31st January 1888 in Turin. He was declared a saint by Pope Pius XI on Easter Sunday, 1st April in 1934. Don Bosco is the patron saint of young people.



In Catholic Christianity, a relic is of immense reverence, and helps to remind individuals of the holiness of a saint, and the fulfilment of God's work through the saint. A relic can consist of anything from the bones of a saint to an object that the saint came in contact with during his or her lifetime.

The 400 kg glass casket containing the wax replica of St John Bosco was received by the Salesian Province Centre in Ascot Vale, Victoria at the end of June. It will be on tour and displayed for prayers and homage at various Salesian works in Melbourne, Sydney, Adelaide, Hobart and Perth from July to September 2023.

The relic stayed at the Catholic Leadership Centre in East Melbourne during the Salesian Biannual Educational Conference in August. It will also journey with the Salesians and many lay members at the Centenary Retreat in the last week of September at the Foothills in Mooroolbark.

The relic statue of St John Bosco will be farewell from Australia during the concluding Mass of the Centenary led by Archbishop Peter Comensoli on Saturday 30th September at St Margaret Mary's parish in North Brunswick at 11:00 am.
