FROM THE PASTOR

JERUSALEM, THE TROUBLED CITY OF PEACE

President Donald Trump this week announced that the United States would relocate the U.S. Embassy in Israel from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem, a process that will take three years in which time an embassy will be built. The reaction, however, has begun immediately. World leaders have stated that such a move will impede the peace process or worse, and Palestinians on the streets are calling for another intifada (uprising). Violent clashes have already begun in Bethlehem and Ramallah between Israeli defence forces and Palestinians. The announcement is a declaration and recognition that Jerusalem is the capital of Israel. However, it is the view of the U.N. that the status of Jerusalem must be the end process of a negotiated peace settlement. The EU foreign policy chief, Federica Mogherini, said the bloc had a united position that Jerusalem must be the capital of both Israel and a future Palestinian state. France said it rejected the "unilateral" US decision, while the UK prime minister, Theresa May, and the foreign secretary, Boris Johnson, both described Trump's announcement as "unhelpful".

The name Jerusalem comes from the root S-L-M, from which the Arabic and Hebrew words Salaam and Shalom are derived, both of which mean "Peace". There is something of an irony in this, being the most fought-over city on earth. Archaeological evidence suggests that the first settlement was established near Gihon Spring between 4500–3500 BC, and the first known mention of the city was in ca. 2000 BC in Egyptian texts in which the city was recorded as *Rusalimum*. The Scriptural history of Jerusalem begins when Abraham meets "Melek Tzedek", (our scriptures spell his name Melchizedek), king of Salem - around 2110 BC (Genesis 14:17-20).

The first establishment of Jerusalem as a Jewish possession was when the city was captured from the Canaanites by the Israelite King David around 1000 BC, who made it his capital. As the site of the Temple, built by Solomon in 957 BC, it became the centre of the Jewish religion. Since then it has shared the troubled history of the area. Jerusalem was totally destroyed by the Babylonians in 586 BC and by the Romans in AD 70. Total destruction by the conquerors ensured that the vanquished nation dispersed and had no central place where they could regroup and reclaim a rebellious national identity.

FROM THE PASTOR (CONTINUED)

The modern-day Palestinians are the descendants of the original Canaanites, Jebusites, Philistines and other tribes. They are both Christian and Muslim. The Muslims claim also to have Abraham as their original father in faith, and for this reason they claim the Dome of the Rock as their sacred site. This Dome of the Rock stands on the same site on which the Jewish First Temple (destroyed by the Babylonians) and Second Temple (destroyed by the Romans) stood. It was on this site, which is also called Mount Moriah, that Abraham offered his son, Isaac, in sacrifice to God. God liberated Isaac and Abraham offered a ram instead. (Gen 22:1-18). This obedience by Abraham was the beginning of the Covenant God made with Abraham and his descendants.

For Christians the city is sacred for it is the place where Jesus was crucified, died, was buried and rose from the dead, and subsequently appeared to the disciples in the upper room of the Last Supper, as well as other places (Jn 18:1-20:29).

It has been fought over by Saracens and Crusaders in the Middle Ages. Between the 16th century and the First World War Jerusalem was part of the Ottoman Empire. From 1947 the city was divided between the states of Israel and Jordan until the Israelis occupied the whole city in June 1967. All in all, during its long history, Jerusalem has been attacked 52 times, captured and recaptured 44 times, besieged 23 times, and utterly destroyed twice.

With differing claims on the right of possession of the City of Peace, a new way must be found for the future. Peace is never possible while one group of people remains disenfranchised, displaced and disempowered. After thousands of years of conflict, a peaceful solution can only be found with compromise and respect for the other. Pope JP II proposed that such a solution might be found in all parties recognising Jerusalem as an international city, hosting both Jews and Palestinians. This is the wiser proposal, for a zero-sum contest will inevitably sow the seed for further conflict. May the infant Prince of Peace bring a new peace to birth in that troubled land.




