FROM THE PASTOR

Practice: The Sacred Heart

Abba Poemen said, "Teach your mouth to say what is in your heart." Many of the desert fathers and mothers, as well as the *Philokalia* in the Eastern Orthodox tradition, have described prayer as bringing your thinking down into your heart. It always seemed like soft piety to me until someone taught me how to do it, and I learned the immense benefits of the prayer of the heart. As a Catholic, I was often puzzled by the continued return to heart imagery, such as Jesus pointing to his "Sacred Heart" and Mary pointing to her "Immaculate Heart." I often wonder what people actually do with these images. Are they mere sentiment? Are they objects of worship or objects of transformation? You must return their gaze and invitation for a long time to get the transformative message and healing. Such images keep recurring only because they are speaking something important from the unconscious, maybe even something necessary for the soul's emergence.

Love lives and thrives in the heart space. It has kept me from wanting to hurt people who have hurt me. It keeps me every day from obsessive, repetitive, or compulsive head games. It can make the difference between being happy and being miserable and negative. Could this be what we are really doing when we say we are praying for someone? Yes, we are holding them in our heart space. Do this in an almost physical sense, and you will see how calmly and quickly it works.

Next time a resentment, negativity, or irritation comes into your mind, and you want to play it out or attach to it, *move that thought or person literally into your heart space.* Dualistic commentaries are lodged in your head; but in your heart, you can surround this negative thought with silence. There it is surrounded with blood, which will often feel warm like coals. In this place, it is almost impossible to comment, judge, create story lines, or remain antagonistic. You are in a place that does not create or feed on contraries but is the natural organ of life, embodiment, and love. Now the Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart have been transferred to you. They are pointing for you to join them there. The "Sacred Heart" is then your heart too.

'The One They Had Pierced' Hos 11:1.3-4.8-9; Eph 38-12.14-19; Jn 19:31-32

The soldiers are only doing their job. The prisoners are not to be left hanging on the cross as the solemn festival begins. Soldiers are sent to break the legs of the criminals to hasten their deaths. A heavy mallet is used to break the legs. Then they notice that Jesus appears to be dead already. So one of them takes his lance and pierces the heart of Jesus just to be sure. 'Not one of his bones shall be broken' is a reference to the Passover lamb that was slain at that very time.

The Beloved disciple, standing with Mary, sees this happen. What he sees strikes him as profoundly significant. From Jesus' side flows blood and water. The hour of glory has come and the Spirit is being poured out over the world. John is interested only in the symbolism. The purpose of his writing is written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name' (20:31).

From the pierced Heart of Jesus flow blood and water. Water is a symbol of the Spirit. Jesus had foretold this in the Temple: 'Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As scripture has said: Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water.' John adds, 'Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive.' (7:37-39) With the water came blood. The price was high. Nothing less than Jesus' complete gift of himself could persuade us of his love.

As you enter the Basilica at Issoudun (France), where the MSC's were founded in 1854, you cannot help being over-powered by the sight of Mary's statue on the left of the altar and the Pierced One crucified at the right of the altar. Mary, who gazes on the pierced Heart of her Son, was given the title 'Our Lady of the Sacred Heart.' She does not shrink from her terrible duty as a mother. She has to be with her son to the last.

HOW CAN I BE INVOLVED IN PLENARY COUNCIL 2020 ?

There are many ways you can be involved.

WHEN WAS THE LAST PLENARY COUNCIL IN AUSTRALIA?

The last Plenary Council was held 80 years ago in Australia in 1937.

WHAT WILL BE ON THE AGENDA FOR THE PLENARY COUNCIL SESSION IN 2020?

The agenda for the first session of the Council will be formed in response to the dialogue and listening process that will happen during 2018-19. After an open and inclusive process of listening, dialogue, prayer and discernment, we will form the Council agenda in late 2019 and early 2020.

WHO ATTENDS THE PLENARY COUNCIL SESSIONS?

"Plenary" refers to the Council being attended by all local churches that are in Australia. This means the geographical dioceses such as Hobart Archdiocese, Lismore Diocese etc., as well as the other local churches, which include the Military Diocese, Eastern Church Eparchies and others of this nature. Altogether, Australia has 34 "local churches".

- All diocesan Archbishops and Bishops;
- All auxiliary Bishops;
- Other titular Bishops who have been given special functions in Australia, either by the Apostolic See or by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference;
- All Vicars General;
- All Episcopal Vicars;
- Some Superiors and Congregational Leaders of religious orders; and
- Some rectors of seminaries in Australia.

Those who *May* be called to the Council include:

- Lay people;
- Clergy;
- Retired Bishops living in Australia at the time of the Council.

The number of people who *can* be called to the Council must be a maximum of *half* of those who *must* be called: i.e. if the total number of people who must be called is 164, then the maximum number of others who *may* be called is 82 people.

All Council delegates have a vote. Some have a *deliberative* vote, while others have a *consultative* vote. The *deliberative* voting is how the final decisions are made at the Council. These deliberative decisions are forwarded to Rome to ensure they are consistent with the universal teachings of the Catholic Church and then the legislation becomes binding for the Catholic Church in Australia.

Others such as advisors and consultors can also be invited to the Council as guests. Observers may also be invited. Anyone invited as a guest or observer does not have voting rights at the Council. **HAVE YOUR SAY -** Everyone is invited to respond to the question:

The delegates of the Council sessions are leaders with particular roles in our local churches. These are outlined in canon law (c. 443) and fall into two categories: those who must be called, and those who can be called.
