<u>POLISH NEWS</u> O Modlitwie różańcowej

Różaniec od początku stał się modlitwą, która została zaaprobowana, ale przede wszystkim umiłowana w Kościele. Widzimy to w życiu i historii świętych ale też w życiu prostych i zwyczajnych ludzi. Do odmawiania różańca nawoływała sama Maryja podczas wielu swoich objawień i dała obietnicę, że kto będzie się modlił w taki sposób, będzie ocalony i ocali świat od nieszczęść spowodowanych przez grzech. Święty Jan Maria Vianney mawiał, że jedno "Zdrowaś Maryjo" wypowiedziane dobrze i z wiarą, potrząsa całym piekłem. Warto pomyśleć, co się tam dzieje, gdy odmawiamy cały różaniec, gdy modli się nim całe grono ludzi, czy też gdy modli się tymi słowami cały Kościół.

Modlitwa różańcowa jest nie tyle przesuwaniem paciorków, ale oddaniem się w obronę Najświętszej Maryi Panny w momencie niebezpieczeństwa lub potrzeby. Wypowiadając słowa modlitwy różańcowej i powtarzając cyklicznie te same słowa odpowiadamy na słowa św. Pawła, który zachęcał pierwsze wspólnoty chrześcijańskie do nieustannej modlitwy. Dzisiejsza forma różańca z ułożonymi stałymi częściami i tajemnicami zaprasza nas do czegoś głębszego i ważniejszego niż tylko pozornie nudnego przesuwania potocznie nazwanych korali. Coraz częściej ulegamy pokusie, by ją tylko odmawiać i nawet może podejmować wyzwania mające na celu nawet i dobre intencje, tak jak nowenna pompejańska, ale jednocześnie gubimy i tracimy to, co staje się jej istotą. Można odnieść czasem wrażenie, że i w Kościele o tym zapominamy, gdy w październiku podejmujemy tą modlitwę, a jednocześnie podchodzimy do niej na zasadzie "zaliczenia", szybkiego odmówienia, bo trzeba, ale nie mamy na nią zbyt dużo czasu. Różaniec potrzebuje i zaprasza nas do tego, żeby się zatrzymać, żeby zwolnić i pozwolić się poprowadzić Duchowi Bożemu tak jak to zrobiła w swoim

życiu Maryja. Nie da się zrozumieć różańca ciągle gdzieś pędząc i chcąc ciągle tylko coś załatwiać.

Sensem zrozumienia tej modlitwy jest słowo, które tak często używał papież Jan Paweł II liście apostolskim Rosarium Virginis Marie ogłaszając jednocześnie Rok Różańca Świętego i dodając kolejną część różańca. Tym słowem jest kontemplacja. Siła tej modlitwy nie tkwi w ilości ale w tym, jak mocno ona nas wciągnie i jak rozpali nasze serca. Jeśli zatracimy w różańcu charakter kontemplacyjny to będziemy ciągle do niej podchodzić albo z przymusu albo na sposób magiczny. Poszczególne tajemnice zapraszają nas do tego, by razem z Maryją przeżywać historię Zbawienia i w tej historii zobaczyć wielkie dzieło Boga. Kontemplując tajemnice z życia Maryi i Jezusa jesteśmy zaproszeni, by nie tylko podziwiać to co się kiedyś wydarzyło, ale by przyjąć te sytuacje w swoim życiu. Powtarzanie słowa za słowem i wpatrywanie się z Maryją w serce Boga sprawia, że jesteśmy obdarowywani tak jak Ona pełnią łask. To notoryczne powtarzanie słów jest napełnianiem swojego serca Dobrą Nowiną.

Październik nie jest jedynym miesiącem na różaniec. Jest on jedynie motywacją i zaproszeniem, by każdego dnia otwierać swoje serce na spotkanie z Bogiem. Jest lekarstwem na nasze niepokoje, lęki i obawy. Jest zaproszeniem Boga do naszych radości i sukcesów i podziękowaniem, że są one tak naprawdę owocem działania w naszym życiu Bożej łaski. Odmawianie różańca wtedy nie staje się przymusem ale potrzebą serca.
