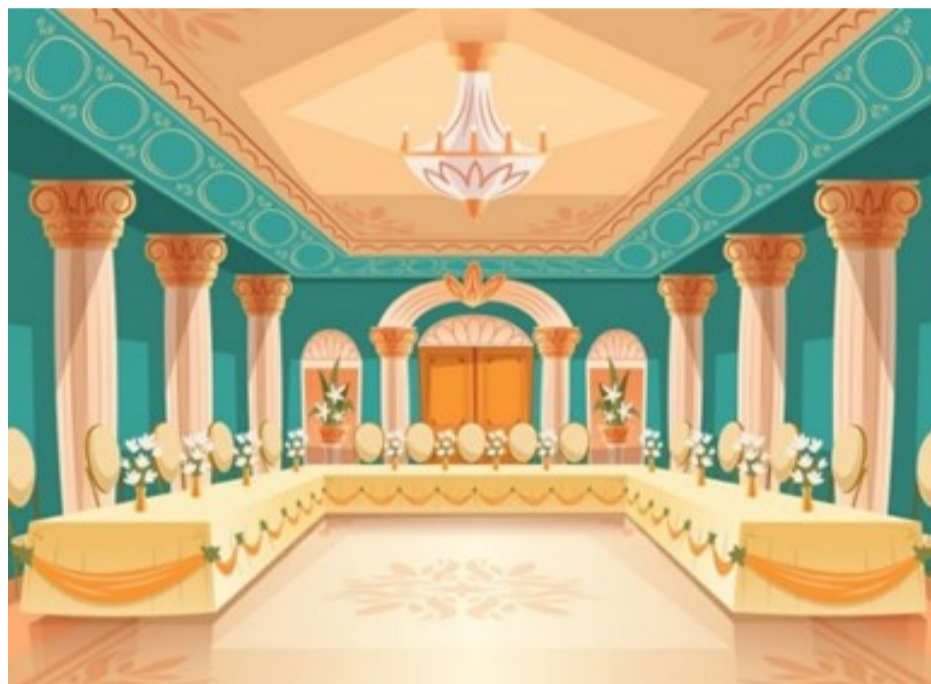

Dear friends, what a great celebration of our feast day for St Therese we had last weekend! I refer especially to the multicultural themed Mass we had on Sunday morning. We had intended to have it "outdoors" in the school assembly area, but rain and wind caused us to move indoors into the school hall, which thankfully could still take double the numbers we can have in the church. That did not dampen the mood for singing or praying in a multitude of languages, or dressing up in our traditional dress, or sharing food. I thank everyone who was willing to play an active role in this Mass to share their voice, language and culture with us. I also like to thank those who took photos on the day and we feature them in this bulletin for your enjoyment.

Many were moved by the Aboriginal inclusion of the 'Our Father' and the rousing recessional song "I am Australian", myself included. We certainly don't sing them enough! I was especially moved during the offertory procession when Louise brought up the gifts, flanked by our young ones Janeena and Johan from the Malayalam community in song led by the Filipino community. This summed up for me the gift we each bring to the parish, and the profound truth of who we are as the Body of Christ. As the song goes: 'We are one, but we are many, and from all the lands on earth we come. We'll share a dream and sing with one voice: "I am, you are, we are Australian"'

The theme in this weekend's readings fittingly enough centre on the banquet God has in store for all peoples, one marked by abundance and brings consolation (Isaiah 25:6-10), one that is inclusive but involves our necessary response and change of heart (Matt 22:1-14). The Gospel especially intends to shock and wake us up to God's invitational

grace that pervades our life if we have eyes to see and ears to hear. The coming together of the parish to celebrate our different cultures/gifts at Mass gives us a glimpse of God's eternal banquet, and we will mark this on special feast days through the year.

POLISH NEWS

Msza odpustowa

Myślę, że większość z was pamięta ze swoich rodzinnych parafii msze św. odpustowe. Kojarzą się one najczęściej z uroczystą Mszą w kościele, a następnie słodkościami odpustowymi, które można było kupić na straganach przy kościele.

Czym jednak są naprawdę Msze św.

odpustowe i dlaczego się je celebrowa?

Odpust parafialny jest doroczną uroczystością rodziny parafialnej związaną ze świętem patronalnym kościoła. W naszym przypadku patronką naszego kościoła jest św. Teresy od Dzieciątka Jezus, której liturgiczne wspomnienie obchodzimy 1 października.

Dzień odpustu jest związany z możliwością uzyskania daru duchowego jakim jest **odpust zupełny** czyli darowanie wszystkich kar doczesnych za popełnione grzechy. Kościół dając możliwość zyskania odpustu zupełnego, wyznacza warunki jakie trzeba spełnić do jego uzyskania. Zwyczajne warunki to spowiedź św., Komunia święta, wolność od przywiązania do jakiegokolwiek grzechu oraz odmówienie modlitw: Ojcze nasz, Wierzę w Boga i dowolnej modlitwy w intencjach Ojca Świętego. Możliwość zyskania odpustu sprawiała, że na odpust ściągła cała okolica, a dla rodziny odpust był okazją do spotkania wielu pokoleń.

Duszpasterze naszej parafii Fr. Krish i Ks. Józef celebrowali tą specjalną Msze odpustową w ostatnią niedzielę. Była ona połączona z zauważeniem wszystkich grup etnicznych należących do naszej parafii. Muszę przyznać, że z zaskoczeniem odkryłam, że parafia św. Teresy to nie tylko Australijczycy i Polacy ale też wiele osób innych narodowości. W czasie Mszy św. zostało podkreślone, że chociaż nie wszyscy swobodnie posługują się językiem angielskim to jednak wszyscy wierzymy w jednego Boga i dzielimy naszą wiarę.

Wiara jest tym, co powinno nas łączyć w jedną zwartą społeczność parafialną. Choć każda grupa etniczna stara się zachować swoją kulturę i odrębność, to jednak musimy pamiętać, że żyjemy w tym kraju, który stał się naszą nową ojczyzną. Liturgia zakończyła się pięknym akcentem jedności, piosenką: I am, you are, we are Australian. Szkoda tylko, że nasza wspólnota polonijna była reprezentowana tylko przez nielicznych przedstawicieli. Myślę, że

historia ponad pięćdziesięcioletniej obecności Polaków w Hobart zobowiązuje nas do dawania lepszego świadectwa. Życzę wszystkim obfitych łask płynących przez pośrednictwo św. Teresy od Dzieciątka Jezus.

SAFE COMMUNITIES PARISH AUDIT

Safe Communities is a Framework and is an initiative of the Archdiocese of Hobart to protect children and vulnerable adults from abuse and neglect. The Framework requires the involvement of everyone in the Catholic Church within the Archdiocese. This Framework has been developed to ensure compliance with the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

As part of this Framework volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy are required to have a current police check and Working with Vulnerable Persons check.

To ensure that the Parish is compliant for the Audit in November 2020, the list of volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy is required to hold the required checks. Failure to obtain these required checks will result in the volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy, not being able to undertake their ministry.
