Bulletin for 3rd Sunday of Lent

Dear friends, on this 3rd Sunday of Lent we are presented in the gospel with Jesus who speaks with a Samaritan woman by the well. She came to draw water to quench her thirst but instead finds in Jesus the source of living water that quenches her deeper thirsts. There is something about water beyond its use for drinking that draws people to it. Earlier in the week, I got to enjoy a short road trip to Cradle Mountain with a brother MSC who is staying with me at the moment. We walked up to Marion's peak and on the way, we trekked past and gazed down at two beautiful lakes: Cradle Lake and Dove Lake. The water was calm and inviting and made me breathe deeply the pristine air that surrounded the panorama of God's beautiful creation in front of me. At the end of the walk, we cooled our sore feet in the ice-cold running water at Ronny Creek. I love the sound of running water because it stirs up life and energy within. On the way back to Hobart, we walked to Liffey Falls in the cool temperate forest of the midlands and experienced the sound and energy of water shaping the landscape and bringing forth a different form of beauty. We then drove back past the Great Lake area and I could not help but notice how people were building their holiday shacks on the slopes around so they faced an unblocked view of the lake. The landscape was rocky and rugged but the calmness of the lake and its potential for trout attracted people there. We are well familiar with our love and thirst for water.

Everybody thirsts. Our physical thirst echoes our inner longing for grace. The woman drinks deeply of the message Jesus gives her when she leaves her water jar behind at the well. She then proceeds to tell the rest of the people in her village who then come to encounter Jesus directly themselves. Have we drunk from the well of Jesus and have we told others about our experience? This is our invitation and challenge as missionary disciples, a term used by Pope Francis in his first encyclical *Evangelii Gaudium* (EG) which describes well the Samaritan woman in her response to Jesus:

"In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the people of God have become missionary disciples (cf. Mt 28:19). ... The new evangelisation calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptised. Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelisation; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: We no longer say that we are 'disciples' and 'missionaries' but rather that we are always 'missionary disciples''' (EG #120) Like her, we start by being conscious of what we thirst for and how we have been fulfilling our thirsts. We have been blessed in the parish with four people (Elise, Narelle, Leisha and Tommy) who are thirsty for more and have joined our Rite for Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) program. All four are teachers with three currently teaching at St Therese's primary school. They have expressed their desire to know Jesus better and be welcomed into the Catholic church. This weekend we introduce them at the 9am Mass to the parish community and present the 'Our Father' as the communal prayer we use together. The RCIA journey will go on to the feast of Pentecost this year and when they are ready, they will make a decision to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and first Communion. Do pray for them on this journey.

Jesus promises the woman: "*Those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty; The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.*" May we all come to know the truth and joy of this statement as we journey on in this season of Lent and may we cannot help but tell others about this good news.
