# FROM THE PASTOR

**EASTER – THE TRIUMPH OF LOVE OVER ALL ELSE** 

Last night I was present again at the L'Arch Beni Abbes dinner and ceremony of the washing of one another's feet in memory of Jesus' action on the night before He died. I was so moved by it that I thought I must write about it for this Easter. Then Clare said to me, "You wrote about this two years ago." I had forgotten that. So I searched my files and found the article I wrote, and re-present it here, slightly edited.

As I write this we are preparing to enter the sacred Easter Triduum beginning with Holy Thursday, through Good Friday and culminating with the Resurrection of Christ at Easter. In our highly developed western world, for a great percentage of people the meaning has been lost, submerged beneath the celebratory frills of hot cross buns, bunnies, chocolate and public holidays... all good things for celebrating this supreme event, but sadly hollow without it. In other ways the world is beset by the evil of hatred expressed in indiscriminate violence, as in numerous terrorist attacks that still plague us.

Yet last night I beheld the meaning of Jesus' life, death and Resurrection in a profound yet simple display of love. I was privileged to be invited to be a part of the celebration of the Seder meal and the washing of the feet with the L'Arche community. It deeply impressed and deeply moved me. There I tangibly touched the meaning of Jesus' life, death and Resurrection. In the simplicity of this communal living and this ritual, I saw not just the re-enactment of Jesus' example (which he left as a symbol of his whole ministry) but the authenticity of the people who do this daily in their humble acts of love and kindness for the ones whom Jesus calls his brothers and sisters, "Whatever you did for even the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40). There is the presence of Jesus bringing good news to the poor, liberating the oppressed, giving sight to the blind,

#### and binding up hearts that are broken.





## FROM THE PASTOR (CONTINUED)

An element of their presence is profound reverence and respect for every person. That then seems to flow over into a peacefulness and quiet joyfulness in each. There is also a wonderful multi-cultural, multi-denominational and multi-faith representation among the community who give their time, service and energy to this community of brothers and sisters of Christ, and it reminds me of the Good Samaritan who came from a different country and had a different faith, yet proved himself a sincere neighbour to the suffering man on the side of the road, according to Jesus. A number of the volunteers have come from across the globe to serve in this community because they share a common love of humanity. Didn't Jesus say, "Whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother" (Mt 12:50)? All these volunteers from various faiths and backgrounds are doing just that, the will of God.

Easter is the fulfilment of Jesus' life on earth. Love of one another is our continuing fulfilment of Jesus' mission. There are many ways in which many of us do our small acts of faith and love for Christ. Our humble service of others may well be the seed that grows into faith in a person who may have forgotten, or never known, the meaning of Easter.

May God bless you and all of your loved ones with joy, peace and inspiration this Easter.
