

70 BE ON EARTH THE HEART OF GOD



Dear friends, we are almost half way through the season of creation and our hope is you would have renewed your experience of the beauty and sacredness of this gift God has given us. Our First Reading from the prophet Isaiah reminds us God is near to all who call upon Him. We are invited to enter into contemplative reverence in the midst of creation before the greatness of God, the source of the Earth and universe. Love of God's creation in all its beauty, intricacy, and goodness can spark love in our hearts and guide us in caring for creation as it needs to be cared for. We heard last weekend how this can look like from Fran Bearman and the school community of their various sustainability initiatives.

The prophet reminds us God's ways are not our ways. This is evident in the Gospel on the parable of the landowner and the workers. The owner of the vineyard gives a full day's wage to all, regardless of how long they worked, and this raised complaints about fairness. But those who worked the longest, the whole day, received what they had agreed was a just wage. The wages of day labourers are often all that their family had to survive on for a given day; so the generosity of the vineyard owner went a long way to meet the people's basic daily needs. This parable shows us the need for a just wage and care that meets the basic needs of all workers.

God's ways challenge us. Catholic Social Tradition reminds us the Earth is God's and everything in it. Creation is a gift of God to all people and living creatures, a gift to provide

for the needs of all for survival, growth, and flourishing. To accumulate and cling to what more than one needs while others live in desperate poverty is a sin against creation and the Creator. Climate change today is a result of the coming together of economic and social systems driven by greed and accumulation, governed to protect inequality, and built upon domination and destruction of our planet Earth. A good question we may ask ourselves is: How can we do more as individuals, families, faith communities, institutes and businesses to heal our relationships with God, with people, with planet Earth in ways that respond with love and care to the cry of the poor and the cry of the Earth?

We continue to break open *Laudato Si'* by drawing on the wisdom of Fr Joshtrom in his latest book '*The Ten Green Commandments*'. The **Third** Commandment listed below starts us on the next step of 'Judge' in the 'See Judge Act' paradigm around which *Laudato Si'* is written.

3. Rediscover a Theological Vision of the Natural World



Creation is a profound act of love on the part of God. When we speak of a theological vision, we are trying to see the world through the 'eyes' of God. There is a deeper truth the Pope suggests, that the physical world is above all God's creation and is permeated with divine presence. Creation is not inert matter or a storehouse of resources, but it is truly Gospel, *evangelion*, that is 'good news'. This 'good news' includes the animals, forests, mountains and waters; all part of God's good news for us. Creation is good

news because:

- 1. It has a basic goodness about it (See the Book of Genesis)
- 2. It has been brought into existence as an act of love on the part of our triune God.

This means to have dominion over the earth is better understood as cultivating, ploughing, tilling, working, protecting, overseeing and preserving. We have no right to trample God's creation underfoot. Every creature is brought into existence out of love and with a definite purpose. We human beings are united as brothers and sisters on a pilgrimage, woven together by the love God has for each creature and which also unites us in fond affection with brother sun, sister moon, brother river and mother earth.



The Pope invites us to see the natural world with Jesus' own gaze on creation:

- 1. He invited his disciples you and I- to recognise the paternal relationship God has with all his creatures. Each one of them is important in God's eyes.
- 2. His gaze was a contemplative one. He often stopped to contemplate the beauty sown by His Father, and invited His disciples to perceive a divine message in things.
- 3. Jesus lived in full harmony with creation. He ennobled human work.

May we come to see Creation as truly God's own *oikos* (house), imbued with the divine presence.

POLISH NEWS

Nowe pokolenie Misjonarek

Dziś chciałabym się podzielić z wami kolejnym wydarzeniem z życia naszej rodziny zakonnej. W poniedziałek 14 września 2020 w święto Podwyższenia Krzyża Matka Ewa Kaczmarek dokonała obrzędu przyjęcia nowych kandydatek do naszego Zgromadzenia. W tym roku do Zgromadzenia wstąpiło siedem dziewcząt z różnych części Polski.

Nowe powołania do wspólnoty zakonnej są ogromną radością ponieważ są potwierdzeniem, że nasza posługa w kościele jest wciąż potrzebna. Pan Bóg wlewając w serca młodych dziewcząt łaskę powołania i posyłając do konkretnej wspólnoty zakonnej pokazuje niejako, że charyzmat naszego zgromadzenia jest wciąż aktualny, a posługa duchowa i fizyczna polskim emigrantom jest nadal potrzebna.

Postulat to roczny czas przejścia ze stanu życia świeckiego do zakonnego. Jest to czas rozeznawania swojego powołania i poznawania życia we wspólnocie zakonnej. Postulatntki pod opieką Mistrzyni Postulatu żyją w rytmie modlitwy, pracy i nauki. Oprócz formacji zakonnej Postulantki poszerzają swoją wiedzę ogólną i religijną. Choć siostry postulantki modlą się i pracują z całą wspólnotą, to jednak żyją ściśle we wspólnocie postulanckiej zajmując wyznaczoną część domu. W czasie okresu postulatu dwukrotnie będą mogły odwiedzić swoje domy rodzinne, jak również najbliższa rodzina będzie mogła odwiedzić je w klaszorze.

W czasie obrzędu przyjęcia do postulatu kandydatka do zgromadzenia otrzymuje szarą sukienkę w kolorze naszego habitu i medalik Matki Bożej. Ten etap formacji jest szczególnie przeżywany pod opieką Matki naszego Pana.W tym czasie postulantki nie noszą nakrycia głowy i w każdym momencie Fran Bearman mogą beż żadnych konsekwencji opuścić Principal zgromadzenie i powrócić do swego domu. Jeśli jednak trwają w przekonaniu, że wybór był właściwy przez rok przygotowują się do rozpoczęcia życia zakonnego w nowicjacie. Polecam, te nasze najmłodsze Misjonarki waszym modlitwom.

HOLY LANDS COLLECTION THIS SUNDAY

This year, due to the closure of churches around the world during Holy Week because of the COVID-19 Pandemic, Pope Francis moved the date for this collection to **THIS** Sunday September 20th to coincide with the Feast of the Exaltation of Holy the Cross on September 14th. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from this collection. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land on Sunday September 20th and please also keep them in your prayers. Donations can be made through the Parish in three different ways:
