BULLETIN FOR THE 4TH WEEK OF LENT

Dear friends, what a sad turn of events in just one week! We gathered last Sunday for worship and Eucharist, reflected on the word of God, prayed for those in need, especially those affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, and received the Body of Christ in the flesh (with the recommended safety precautions in place). Since then, in response to the spike in infections, a few measures taken by the Federal and State governments and by the Church have meant that Australia has closed its borders to non-Australian citizens, Tasmania is strictly limiting interstate travel and the Church here has suspended all public Masses and offered dispensation for all from our Sunday Mass obligation. These are all big moves that shock us and may cause us to feel they are an over-reaction, but it has driven home to all of us the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic is real and cannot be under-estimated. The situation in Europe and America has showed us how a delayed reaction is still worse than an over-reaction. It is comforting to know the bottom line is people's health and lives rather than the economy that no doubt will take a hit with tourism and employment to suffer greatly as a result. During this time, as much as we are tempted to be anxious and negative about all these measures, let us also know that this too will pass but it means having to go through very uncomfortable change in the meantime with the way we conduct our lives and relationships with others, how we have to be more self-conscious with our health and hygiene, and how we continue to be church. The measures are meant to point to social distancing as a way of reducing the spread of the disease, but social distancing should not come to mean social isolation.

I have been with you in the parish community for barely two months and I have enjoyed how you put on your name tags to introduce yourselves to me and how I often (still) struggle to remember your names. I am thankful I have come to know some of you better in this time. It's been a gradual process of getting to know each other and unfortunately, this has been rudely interrupted. I will miss that and the feel of community every Sunday brings. At the same time, this new situation (a new normal maybe?) also provides other opportunities to connect to community. We are blessed to be living in this time where we have technology and social media to suggest other means of connection with each other. Deacon Michael has been a great help in helping to disseminate the recent announcements from the bishop on suspension of Masses by email and text through our PACS system, using the information you have given us.

Our website and Facebook pages have also helped to spread the news especially to our younger audience. If you know of anyone who has missed out in these channels of information, please let us know and we are happy to update our system. I am conscious our older audience might not have emails and FB accounts or know how to access websites, so I ask you to help one another stay connected in this time or let us know and we are happy to mail them any resources. We will endeavour to send out our bulletins and any other updates weekly and we hope to do a recording of or live stream the Sunday Mass or give that out on a USB so we stay connected as church. No doubt this is not quite the same as face to face ministry or receiving Eucharist in the flesh, but it can provide opportunities for families and neighbours in small numbers to gather together to pray and reflect on the word of God and be in spiritual communion with each other. In times like this when we are not able to receive Christ in the Eucharist, we are invited to encounter Christ in the Word and in our neighbour, especially those who are in need during this time. We will also continue to visit the sick and homebound when permitted.

In this turmoil, prayer is needed more than ever before and while we cannot gather for Eucharist, the church will remain open (10am to 6pm daily) for personal prayer, visits and small group meetings. The stations of the cross for Lent will continue on Fridays at 1130am followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 12-4pm. Come and spend time with the Lord, but do maintain a respectful distance with each other. Individual reconciliation will continue to be offered on Saturday mornings at 11am. Life has changed but it will go on with some familiar elements. Last week, we read in the Gospel of John about the woman at the well, who believed in Jesus and inspired others to believe by her preaching. This Sunday, John gives us another unnamed person who became a model of faith and discipleship - a man born blind. This man had been blind from birth. When he encountered Jesus, he is healed, given sight he never had and testified to what Jesus did for him. As John sees it, we are all born blind. When we encounter and accept Christ, we finally truly see. This season of Lent provides a good time to open our eyes to encounter Christ in these times of tragedy and turmoil and come to see the beauty and grace that often accompany such times that can be easily missed. Let me leave you with an anonymous poem I received earlier this week noticing exactly this grace in our suffering.

Yes there is fear. Yes there is isolation. Yes there is panic buying. Yes there is sickness. Yes there is even death.

But, they say that in Wuhan after so many years of noise you can hear the birds again.

They say that after just a few weeks of quiet,

the sky is no longer thick with fumes but blue and grey and clear.

They say that in the streets of Assisi, people are singing to each other across the empty squares, keeping their windows open, so that those who are alone may hear the sounds of family around them.

They say that a hotel in the West of Ireland is offering free meals and delivery to the housebound.

Today a young woman I know is busy spreading fliers with her number through the neighbourhood so that the elders may have someone to call on.

Today Churches, Synagogues, Mosques and Temples are preparing to welcome and shelter the homeless, the sick, the weary.

All over the world people are slowing down and reflecting.

All over the world people are looking at their neighbours in a new way.

All over the world people are waking up to a new reality:

To how big we really are.
To how little control we really have.
To what really matters.
To Love.

So we pray and we remember that:
Yes there is fear.
But there does not have to be hate.
Yes there is isolation.
But there does not have to be loneliness.
Yes there is panic buying.
But there does not have to be meanness.
Yes there is sickness.
But there does not have to be disease of the soul.
Yes there is even death.
But there can always be a rebirth of love.

Wake to the choices you make as to how to live now
Today, breathe.
Listen, behind the factory noises of your panic,
The birds are singing again
The sky is clearing,
Spring is coming,
And we are always encompassed by Love.
Open the windows of your soul,
And though you may not be able to touch across the empty square,
Sing.

NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

In light of the ongoing developments in relation to COVID-19 we wanted to provide all parishioners with an update as we all have a part to play in the prevention of the spread of this disease. We also have a duty of care to the health and wellbeing of all, and to ensure we are being vigilant in managing this outbreak. COVID-19 is a respiratory illness with symptoms ranging

from a mild cough to pneumonia. Some people recover easily, others may get very sick very quickly. There is evidence that it spreads from person to person. The safety and welfare of our Parish community is really important and we endeavour to promote and provide a safe environment for all.

In the Church foyer is a letter from the Archbishop, advising of the cancellation of all Masses which commenced on Thursday, 18th March 2020, and remains in place until • further notice. Below is some further information during this time:

- The Church will be open from 10:00am to 6:00pm daily for private prayer.
- Reconciliation will continue to be held between 11:00am-11:30am each Saturday.
- Baptisms, Funeral and Weddings will be restricted to only immediate family members.
- You are encouraged to maintain a safe distance (1.5 metres) from anyone in the If you are unsure please call the Parish church when your arrive.
- The number allowed in the church at any one time will be restricted.

It is also recommended:

- To continue the practice of good hygiene to prevent the spread of colds and infection. Transmission of infections can be reduced by 80% simply by regular washing of hands;
- Keep all surfaces clean;
- Frequently clean hands by using an alcohol-based hand sanitiser or soap and water;
- When coughing and sneezing cover mouth and nose with flexed elbow or tissue – throw tissue away immediately in a sealed bin and wash hands;
- Avoid close contact with anyone who has fever and cough;
- If you have fever, cough and difficulty breathing, seek medical care early and share previous travel history with your health care provider.
