FROM THE PASTOR



HARMONY WEEK AND NEW ZEALAND

This last week was Harmony Week, an expansion of Harmony Day which fell on the 21st March, coinciding with the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. It is a tragic irony that it was preceded on the Friday before by the violent massacre of fifty innocent people at prayer in Christchurch, New Zealand, and the wounding of fifty more at the Al Noor Mosque and the Linwood Islamic Centre. This horrific event has shaken and traumatised the people of New Zealand, and people here and throughout the world. It could well uncover the wounds of people here in Tasmania who also know this violence.

In a way, Harmony Week shines a focus on what we all can be, the type of people and community and world that we can aspire to be. It gives us a higher vision, a vision we receive from Christ who said, "Whatever you did for the least of these, you did for me" (cf Mt 5:31-46), and who gave us the parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk 10:25-37). Pope Francis repeated his call for this when he addressed the Diplomatic Corp at the Vatican in January, saying that without respect for the transcendent dimension of (all) humanity, and without the defence and promotion of universal human rights, there is always the risk of "new forms of inequality, injustice, discrimination and, in extreme cases, *new forms of violence and oppression*. The international community is called on to defend…refugees and migrants".

In Harmony Week the nation of New Zealand and nations around the world including peoples of all faiths gathered in solidarity and compassion around the traumatised and grieving members of the Muslim faith in Christchurch. We are all children of one God. When we see beyond difference and see ourselves in the other, then we will see with the eyes of God.

FROM THE PASTOR

To the people of Al Noor Mosque in Christchurch, to all our Muslim Brothers and Sisters in New Zealand, and to all the people of New Zealand,

We, the members of St Therese of Lisieux Catholic Church in Moonah, Tasmania, are with you in solidarity at this time of tragedy in your lives. As we gathered in prayer at Mass last weekend we prayed for all those who lost their lives, for you who are injured and for you who survived and now have to live with this memory. As we gather for worship again this weekend we will hold you in prayer again. The people of Tasmania have suffered in a similar event twenty-three years ago.

We have seen with admiration the uninhibited heartfelt expression of forgiveness given by Farhid Ahmed, to the man who killed his wife, Husna. This forgiveness was given to the gunman with the words, "I still love you". We have seen the courage and grace of your prayer leaders. And we have seen the wisdom, compassion and empathy of your Prime Minister, Ms Jacinda Ardern. May all of you, by the grace of God, find spiritual, emotional and physical healing.

The Plenary Council organisers invited us to freely submit our thoughts. When I published my Plenary Council submissions I did so in the interests of transparency, that what I submitted to the conversation at the Council could be provided as information to the parishioners, and thrown into the arena of ideas. Many people responded favourably to this and appreciated that these expressions corresponded to their own line of thought. However, what I failed to foresee was that several people would be, and were hurt or scandalised by the presentation of least two of these topics which are aspects of Church teaching. That weighs heavily on me, because I do not want any person to be hurt by what I say or do. It actually worries me deeply that my action could unintentionally hurt any one of my brothers and sisters. For the hurt caused, I sincerely apologise. As a priest and pastor, in those domains of Church teaching I would have been more prudent to leave it solely in the arena of the Plenary Council, rather than the bulletin. I would certainly appreciate anyone who was badly affected by my comments there or in anything I may have said, to come and speak to me.

supermarket, look for chocolate that has one of these three symbols. If you can't find any, ask the manager if they stock any.









