FROM THE PASTOR

CHRISTMAS – THE IMPOSSIBLE BECOMES POSSIBLE

Christmas is out of the ordinary! Christmas lifts our spirits, raises our hopes, gives us an infusion of joy. Every year it returns, and yet every year it offers us something new. It invites us to believe that all things good and positive are possible. In fact, the story tells us that the impossible is possible for people who have faith.

The Christmas story begins in Luke's gospel with the Angel Gabriel visiting Zechariah and telling him that his prayer has been heard and that his wife, Elizabeth, is going to conceive and give birth to a son. This is an impossibility because Elizabeth was barren all her life and childless, and now is well on in years and past childbearing age. Nonetheless, in spite of Zechariah's doubt and incredulity, Elizabeth does conceive and subsequently gives birth to John.

The story, which is familiar to us all, moves to the town of Nazareth where the Angel Gabriel visits Mary, a young virgin, and announces that she is to conceive and give birth to a son. She is bewildered by the announcement because she is a virgin, and the angel assures her that the power of God can and will do this, and announces that it has already been done to Elizabeth, for *nothing is impossible for God*. Mary then invites this word, this creative action of God to be done to her, and it is. The virgin gives birth to Jesus.

The emphasis in both of these instances is that the impossible becomes possible when the Spirit of God is invited in and believed in.

Last week, we were shown by Marty Ogle a video clip which displayed what he calls a "Spirit of Jesus moment" in the work he does with school students. It presents to us a young lady, Mandy Harvey, who performed on *America's Got Talent*. With her devoted father standing in the wings, she explains to the compere that she is deaf because of a neurological illness she acquired when she was eighteen. From age four until then she sang and played music, but then gave up for the next ten years. Now she has written a song called "Try". She stands barefooted on stage so she can feel the beat of the bass guitar and the keyboard…, plays the ukulele… and trusting her vocal pitch, sings. Her performance had the audience on its feet shedding tears of happiness.

At age eighteen she gave up. From age eighteen until twenty-nine she believed it impossible that she would sing again. On that night, the impossible became possible ... manifested before us.

Does she have a faith in God? I don't know. Was the Spirit of God at work there? Indeed it was!

Back home in Australia, it must have seemed a forlorn hope to the First Nations of this country a century ago that they would ever be treated with equal rights, that they would have the right to possess their ancestral lands of tens of thousands of years, in a country which had a legal doctrine of *terra nullius*, a term coined by Cpt James Cook. It may have seemed an impossibility. Yet, in a David and Goliath struggle for land rights, a simple gardener at James Cook University (this having an irony in itself) led a ten-year struggle which resulted, on the 3rd June 1992, in the High Court of Australia overturning that legal doctrine and establishing land rights. What once would have been impossible became possible... and manifest.

What else appears impossible in our world? Peace in the Middle East and Africa? Justice and equity among the world's peoples? The healing of a heart that has been broken? Reconciling a rupture in the family relationships?

We Christians have become somewhat used to the name, Emmanuel, meaning God Is With Us, yet the idea of the Divine One, the Creator of All That Is, being born, being human, being one of us is an impossibility to imagine, yet this is the event beyond imagining that we are celebrating. This impossibility became possible... and manifest! Thus, God is with us, not only when Christ was physically born and living among us as a man, but for all time in every person, every circumstance, every moment of joy, every time of trial, every moment of desperation.

Gerard W. Hughes wrote a book which he entitled *God of Surprises*. In short, he explains how to discern God's presence in each of our life situations. The incarnation of Christ is <u>the</u> extraordinary statement that God can surprise us in any moment of our lives. Whatever situation we may find ourselves in, God can resolve in an unexpected way. What is humanly impossible, God can turn on its head, and a previously unimagined possibility can present itself to us if we open our eyes of faith and trust in the unexpected.

May your eyes of faith perceive something new that the God of Surprises want to give you this Christmas. May Peace, Hope, Joy and Love be yours.
