FROM THE PASTOR

SUFFERING AND THE PASSION OF CHRIST

Suffering is an inevitable part of life. Everything that lives, dies. When we are born, our mothers suffered excruciating pain, and we did as well when passing through the birth canal, although we don't remember it. It seems evident too, that many of the major periods of growth are accompanied by pain. There is birth, and then the baby gets teeth, another painful time. Puberty and adolescence is another period of growth which is frequently emotionally painful for both child and parent. When couples experience a crisis in their relationship it causes much suffering, and yet when they persevere and work through their difficulties I have frequently heard them describe that as a graced time through which they grew and deepened their relationship.

Our ancestors were probably more accustomed to suffering than is our modern generation in the developed world, for they lived without the medical supports that we presently expect, as well as all other devices that facilitate our lifestyles. It is common for us to rail at adversity and suffering as if it has no place in our lives, as if it should not be at all. In our litigious society it is also common for us to look for someone to blame for any suffering that comes our way. On the one hand, that can demand accountability and responsibility from people, and can be necessary. But taken to an extreme it can deny reality, i.e. it can deny that suffering should have any place in my life whatsoever. Personally, I must admit that I can frequently fall into this attitude of grizzling and cussing when things go wrong, usually only to myself, even though I begin each day with the prayer I learned as a child, O Jesus, through the most pure heart of Mary, I offer you all my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of Your divine Heart.

Yes, there is suffering, and it is woven into the fabric of life. Sometimes it is caused by the evil actions of others, such as the Holocaust or other wanton violence; at other times it happens as a result of no ill-intent but by unintended consequences or poor judgement. The Tasman bridge disaster would be one such occurrence. And at other times it occurs entirely by accident or misfortune, e.g. bushfire, a falling tree or disease.

We often look for reasons for suffering in order to try to make sense of it. This will have an element of an unconscious attempt to gain some control over the uncontrollable, in the hope that this will in some way diminish the suffering. However, the wisdom of ancient and modern sages is that peace descends upon us when we are able to arrive at a gracious acceptance of suffering in its mystery, knowing that we can't control it. Yet even our intention to accept whatever suffering the day may deliver to us and offer it to God, may vanish when we are in the midst of the pain.

FROM THE PASTOR (CONTINUED)

Elizabeth Kubler-Ross, who sat with many patients through their dying days, recognised a pattern in the stages they went through as they approached their deaths. Usually the first is Denial – 'This can't be happening to me…', then Anger – 'Why me?!'. The third stage is Bargaining – 'God, let me live and I'll dedicate myself to…'. Then comes Depression. Finally, one arrives at the grace of Acceptance. At this point there is peace. Any form of grave suffering can bring upon us these stages of grief, and they can be rather less neat and tidy as this description suggests. The more saintly people among us may have developed the grace of acceptance through the habits of a lifetime, the daily dyings to self.

Jesus' Passion is truly the paradigm of suffering for us to gaze upon and contemplate. He is described in the Gospels as experiencing all of his suffering in a very human, fragile way. He asks God to "Let this cup pass me by...". Is this bargaining? He then accepts, "Let your will be done, not mine". One of the Gospels states that "an angel came to console him". This suggests peace, at least at a deep level, while at another level he would have been racked with fear. In his humanness he felt totally abandoned by God, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?". Yet that changed to, "Into your hands I commit my spirit."...acceptance, surrender, peace.

The Crucifixion is an incomplete story without the Resurrection. The Resurrection of Jesus is not just for him, it is for us. While his Crucifixion is his declaration of Love, his Resurrection is his declaration of Hope... for all of us. All of our sufferings, united to his, are never again meaningless. Our sufferings, united to his, become redemptive. How? We don't know and we don't have to know. It's beyond our control. But when we offer it to him we enter the graced stage of acceptance, and it transforms, and it becomes the Resurrection. This is our faith and everyone who believes this can draw hope from it. "God turns all things to their good for those who love him" (Rom 8:28).

COLES - SPORTS FOR SCHOOLS DOCKETS


