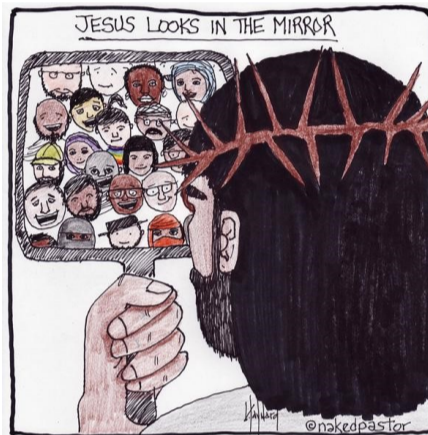

TO BE ON EARTH THE HEART OF GOD

Dear friends, what a joy to gather as a parish community again last weekend when we celebrated together the Feast of the Sacred Heart! For those who have not been in the loop, or are still feeling uncertain about turning up, I like to specially invite you to join us again for our weekend Masses. Our parish is a safe space with all the necessary hygienic and social distancing measures in place (thanks to Michael, our ushers and cleaners) and we will welcome you back, perhaps not literally with open arms but certainly with beaming smiles. Although restrictions have lifted on Friday to allow a maximum of 250 indoors, we are still limited by social distancing measures and the length and number of pews we have, so 60 is our limit. We do have more weekend Masses offered so no one will need to miss out. We just ask you to book in advance so you can get your first preference.

We resume our Sundays in Ordinary time and this weekend the theme is on hospitality. In the First Reading, a woman of influence shows hospitality to the prophet Elisha. She recognises him as a man of God, offers him food and even provides him a furnished room when he visits. Elisha's servant, Gehazi, reports that this woman has an ageing husband and no son, which could suggest that she has been unable to conceive. Elisha promises that she will embrace a son, and as the narrative continues beyond today's reading, she gives birth to this miraculous child. There is no telling how an act of hospitality offered without expecting anything back can bless the giver. How welcoming are we to each other? Do we welcome the stranger, the outsider, the refugee amongst us?

As we re-emerge from the pandemic and reconnect with each other in the parish, creative initiative is perhaps needed to overcome our fears as we allow ourselves to go beyond the usual routine to truly know one other. Hospitality reminds us to live our Christian call to turn outwards, to reach out, to love our neighbour whoever that might be. It reminds us to


encounter and receive Jesus in our lives through the other, known or unknown, alike or different, in a new way. Sister Joan Chittister says, *'Hospitality is the way we come out of ourselves. It is the first step toward dismantling the barriers of the world. Hospitality is the way we turn a prejudiced world around, one heart at a time.'*

Today's Gospel is an excerpt from the missionary discourse (Mt 10:1-11:1). Jesus points to the need for being hospitable to any of his disciples even the little ones, people we might not even notice if we do not keep our eyes open and our hearts receptive. He says: "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." (Mt 10:40). This message anticipates some people will reject the apostles and the message of the Gospel. But for those who are open and welcoming to the good news, their 'reward' is to know Jesus, and through Him the Father in heaven. In leading up to this, Jesus reminds the Twelve of the costly demands of discipleship, to love Him more than their own parents and children. Likewise, they must "take up their cross," which involves acts of self-sacrifice. Jesus wants His followers and us to recognise fully the implications of our decision to believe.

Faith is not passive or easy. It is an active engagement with God and community. Devoting ourselves to God will result in a life of sacrifice for the sake of others. On this second weekend back, we continue to emphasise the Way forward is Jesus, and the need to journey together as a community into the heart of Jesus. We like to find out where you are in your faith journey as we re-emerge after more than 3 months of parish lock-down. Attached to the bulletin is a questionnaire we will be asking people to fill up at Masses this weekend during the homily. If you are unable to be at Mass, we will still like to hear from you. Fill up the questionnaire and send it back to us at the parish office by this week. It will help us map the Way forward as we look to rebuild our parish community.

POLISH NEWS

W Sercu Jezusa

Tydzień temu mówiliśmy sobie, że miesiąc
czerwiec jest poświęcony Najświętszemu
Sercu Jezusa. W tym też szczególnym
miesiącu możemy cieszyć się z ponownego
otwarcia kościoła pw. Św. Teresy i powrotu
do normalnego działania parafii.

Po doświadczeniach pandemi koronawirusa
otwarcie kościoła i powrót do działań
duszpasterskich zachęca nas do tego, by
zadać sobie pytanie; Jak to życie naszej
wspólnoty ludzi wierzących powinno
wyglądać?

Jedni przyjęli z radością wiadomość o
możliwości uczestnictwa w Eucharystii i
przyjmowania do serca Ciała Chrystusa, inni
wyrażają swoje niezadowolenie, że w

kościół obowiązuje nowe zasady, jeszcze inni są zdenerwowani z powodu konieczności rezerwacji czy niemożności uczestniczenia we Mszy o tej godzinie, o której chcą. Wszystkie te sprawy owszem nastroją nam pewne niedogodności jednak nie stanowią one istoty naszej wspólnoty ludzi wierzących spotykających się w kościele św. Teresy.

We fragmencie Ewangelii wg św. Mateusza przeznaczonym na tą niedzielę słyszymy Jezusa nauczającego swoich uczniów: „Kto nie bierze swego krzyża, a idzie za Mną, nie jest Mnie godzien. Kto chce znaleźć swe życie, straci je, a kto straci swe życie z mego powodu, ten je znajdzie”. Jezus uświadamia nam, że krzyż i trudności są wpisane w nasze życie i On doskonale wie o naszych zmaganiach. Pragnie jednak nie naszego cierpienia ale zwrócenia naszego serca do Niego, naszego poddania się Jego woli. W sytuacjach kiedy spotykają nas różne trudne doświadczenia możemy mieć poczucie straty. Nie mogę usiąść w mojej ulubionej ławce, nie mogę uczestniczyć we Mszy św. o godz. 11 tej bo już nie ma miejsca, nie mogę przyjmować Komunii św. do ust, bo teraz Komunia św. jest dozwolona tylko na rękę.

Pragnę jednak zachęcić wszystkich do popatrzenia na tą sytuację od pozytywnej strony. Czy istotą naszego przychodzenia do kościoła nie jest sam Jezus Chrystus? Czy to nie od Niego czerpiemy duchowe siły, czy to nie dzięki karmieniu się Jego Ciałem możemy wydobywać w naszego serca pokłady dobra i wzajemnej życzliwości? Pamiętajmy, że każda strata pomaga nam zauważać dobro, które Jezus dla nas przygotował, a którego dotąd nie widzieliśmy będąc skoncentrowani na „naszych sprawach”.

Nowy program duszpasterski „The Way Forward” (Droga Naprzód) zachęca nas do tego byśmy zamieszkali w Sercu Jezusa i uczyli się od Niego, bo On jest cichy i pokorny sercem. Naśladując Jezusa starajmy

się o to, by nasze serca były przepełnione miłością i dobrocią, byśmy dawali świadectwo prawdziwie chrześcijańskiego życia. Zwróćmy uwagę na to, żeby ci, którzy są obok nas czuli się akceptowani, przyjęci i otoczeni troską. Pamiętajmy, że ławka na której siedzę w kościele nie pójdzie ze mną do nieba, ale człowiek, który siedzi obok mnie - tak.

Podziękujmy naszemu Panu za wszystkich członków naszej wspólnoty parafialnej i pamiętajmy o wdzięczności za to, że udało nam się przeżyć pandemię bez żadnej szkody. Życzę wszystkim pięknego tygodnia.

***Laudato Si'* Corner**

Chapter Five of *Laudato Si'* is titled "Lines of Approach and Action." The previous chapters offered a more diagnostic look at the state of our planet. They emphasised the human, economic, and cultural causes of the crises before us – from pollution and climate change to consumerism and poverty. The previous chapters also outlined core themes from our faith tradition and from recent scientific study that could offer a way forward in rethinking how we can live on the planet, conscious we are inter-connected and called to be life-giving. Chapters five and six now begin to outline concrete steps of action and opportunities for dialogue which, as Pope Francis says, "can help us escape the spiral of self-destruction" (#163). In particular, chapter five focuses on the political and economic paths for dialogue. Straight away, he calls for the immediate replacement of "technology based on the use of highly polluting fossil fuels – especially coal, but also oil and, to a lesser degree, gas" (#165).

He acknowledges that the international community has not been able to agree on how to transition to more renewable energy but challenges us to move from a place of irresponsibility to a state of generous and noble dialogue. He challenges nations and their leaders to move beyond short-term gain to what he calls "true statecraft," that is when leaders "uphold high principles and think of the long-term common good" (#178, 181). He also challenges the economic sector to move beyond maximisation of profit at the expense of our planet and the poor. The market should serve life in the Church's long-standing teaching about the economy. Thus, investing for a more life-giving future will require, creativity in coming up with models of development, a redefinition of our notion of progress, and a farsighted and interdisciplinary approach (#189-198).
