HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL

Hope springs eternal in the human breast; Man never is, but always to be blessed: The soul, uneasy and confined from home, Rests and expatiates in a life to come.

- Alexander Pope, An Essay on Man

The birth of Christ, the infant of Bethlehem, is the beginning of the fulfilment of the deepest hopes of the human heart. And this fulfilment is still being accomplished today. It is a work in progress, so to speak, and the only way it can reach its total fulfilment is with our commitment to accomplish it, with our participation in the work of Christ.

People live in hope. Our souls feed on it. It holds the promise of things as yet unknown that will one day be dreams fulfilled. Newlyweds hope for a child. Prisoners hope for freedom. Parents hope that their children will grow up to be people of wisdom, character and virtue. And in the most desperate situations such as in the current conflict, people retain hope for peace and justice to emerge. Some hope for a new life in a new land.

Hope does spring eternal in the human heart because we are "wired" to believe in a providential benevolence that is always leading us to a higher good, to freedom, life, joy and peace. We recognise - we know - this providential benevolence as the Spirit of God. And this Spirit of God leads us to progress as human beings to become more human. We can see this progress when we look at the beginnings of this nation of Australia, and compare it to the nation we enjoy today. It began as a penal colony, a prison, and a brutal one at that. It went through a long and violent labour to be born as a nation, and then a long and at times painful period of maturation to become the nation with one of the highest levels of human rights protections in the world. It's not a perfect country, and there is a lot of work to be done, but it is a far cry from our beginnings. The Spirit of God has led us as a nation to become more reverent toward one another.

It is the nature of God to create, to re-create, to renew, to liberate people who are oppressed, to replace barbarity with compassion, to lift us up to a more noble humanity. Jesus was born into a less-than-truly-human world, an innocent and vulnerable infant without power, without status. His people, Israel, hoped for a redeemer, a Messiah. They were oppressed beneath the heel of a mighty and brutal power, Rome. As an infant, Jesus was under threat from Herod, king of Israel. It was in this world that Jesus grew from an infant to manhood, inspired by the faith and vision of Moses, a vision of compassion and justice, and immersed in the personal love of his God to whom he related as intimately as a son to a father. The other two members of the Holy Family are critical to this development of Jesus. Both Mary and Joseph were totally open to the will of God for them. Mary, in her completely attentive contemplation of her personal God, heard the Word of God, said Yes to God's will for her, conceived and brought to birth Jesus who is Christ. This was her constant orientation, and thus it was the constant example which Jesus absorbed from infancy through to manhood. Likewise, Joseph was attentive and sensitive to the Word of God which he heard clearly in the still of night on the two recorded occasions. He, too, throughout his life set this constant example for Jesus which Jesus absorbed from infancy to manhood. Jesus learned His faith, and absorbed the Spirit of it, through their embodiment of it. The Gospel says Joseph was a just man. The little that is described of Joseph and Mary reveals much more of the influence they were on the growth in personality and character, vision and principle of Jesus.

At his baptism, he got the full vision of God's plan for the human family. The vision and Jesus became one. He lived the vision to the full, and in this he revealed the infinite love of God to the world. He revealed our true humanity to us, the most noble humanity possible, and showed us **who we can be**. He has raised our vision and aspiration to its highest level. He has deepened our hope that his vision for us will be fulfilled in us.

This is Christ the Lord, born among us, Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Child of the Holy Family, a member of the Human Family. Come, let us adore him. Let us give our hearts completely to him. Let us become one with him.

May the Infant Christ be born in your hearts and grow to fulfilment. May Christmas always be a Season within your Heart.

THE HOLY FAMILY - JOSEPH

Sir 3:3-7, 14-17; Col 3:17-21 Mt 2:12-15, 19-23

As we celebrate Christmas, we focus on the Holy Family. Today let us focus more closely on the figure of Joseph, the discreet and just man.

In Matthew's Gospel, there is an emphasis on the mindset of the Jewish people. This is the only mention of the flight into Egypt. It is set against the backdrop of the whole history of the Chosen People. These events occur immediately after the Magi have left the home. Herod is threatening the lives of all those children who are under a certain age. Genocide is something we have come to associate with modern times. Yet it has been going on for thousands of years. Herod does not want to lose his power. Joseph has a dream and decides to take the family to Egypt. (v.14)

The original story of Egypt goes back to the exile of the first Joseph, the youngest son of Jacob. His brothers had sold him into slavery in Egypt. Yet he rose from that position of slave to become the most powerful man in the country after the Pharaoh. When the time was right, hundreds of years later, Moses led the people out of Egypt to the Promised Land. This recalls the words of the prophet Hosea: that their needs are met. I called my son out of Egypt. (Hos 11:1) As Moses led the people out of slavery in Egypt, so Jesus was destined to lead his people out of the slavery to sin.

When Herod has died, Joseph again has a dream and takes the mother and child back to the Promised Land. Prudently, Joseph decides not to go back to Judea because he feels it is still too dangerous for the child. Instead he settles in the town of Nazareth in Galilee.

As the father of the household, Joseph makes all the decisions. He is the one who shows concern for the safety of the mother and child. We are also called to look after

those who are frail in our community to see
