Dear friends, this weekend we mark the beginning of the season of Advent and the start of a new cycle of liturgical readings. In Year B, we will read from the Gospel of Mark, the earliest of the four Gospels to be written. Mark was writing shortly after the destruction of the Temple by the Roman armies at the fall of Jerusalem, about 40 years after the death of Jesus. Living during this tumultuous time of revolt, Mark and his community thought the end-times were near. Hence the call in the Gospel (Mark 13:33-37) to "Be on your guard, stay awake," like servants entrusted with the care for a house who continually watch for their master's return.

Derived from a Latin root, Advent means 'coming' or 'arrival'. Lasting four weeks, it is traditionally a season of quiet waiting and joyful expectancy. The season has a twofold character: a time of preparation for Christmas when the first coming of God's son to the world is recalled; as well as a time of reflection pointing us to Christ's second coming at the end of time, calling us to conversion here and now. The candle of hope we light reminds us God has and will continue to be faithful to us as Emmanuel – God-with-us. Like Mark's first-century audience, many of us today have been living in a state of uncertainty and anxiety post-Covid. How do we stay awake with hope in such a time as this?

We have begun the journey of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) with three enquirers. There was robust discussion over what staying awake meant for us as we discussed the Sunday's gospel. Our reflections include: being aware of the present; preparing for what is to come; fear of missing out (!); simply doing the everyday task of what God has called us to do; motivated by love and not fear. I love the collective wisdom! We will also be drawing from the wisdom of those in our community as we listen to their Advent reflections at Mass. Last Sunday, the Polish community organised a modified celebration of Christ the King that included a procession in the school hall, instead of the usual school and parish grounds. The liturgy was festive and just as meaningful, and we had morning tea after. Enjoy the photos!

END-OF-LIFE CHOICES (VOLUNTARY ASSISTED DYING) BILL 2020

This Bill was heavily amended but was passed by the Legislative Council on November 10 and now moves into the House of Assembly for further consideration. The amended Bill now requires a person to have less than 6 months to live or 12 months for someone with a neurodegenerative condition before they are eligible for either assisted suicide or euthanasia. Despite this extra requirement, this Bill and every other one of this nature can never remove the risk that vulnerable people could die due to elder abuse or medical neglect. You may wish to contact your local members of the House of Assembly by email, letter or phone to make clear your concerns about this Bill. An action brief and further details are available in the Church foyer.
