Dear friends, on this first weekend of August, let us celebrate! First the readings point us to a God who fills our hunger and thirst for more, at no cost! The prophet Isaiah proclaims God's invitation (Isa 55:1-3): come to the water all who are thirsty, though you have no money, come! In the Gospel Jesus feeds a hungry crowd miraculously (Matt 14:13-21) by recognising their needs beyond the physical. If they were ignorant, he taught them. If they were sinners, he forgave them. If they brought their sick, he healed them. If they were hungry, he fed them. No one who yearned and brought their yearning to him was unanswered, not even the women and their children. He continues to feed us with his abundant life even today through the Eucharist, motivated by love for us, as Paul reminds us (Rom 8:35-39) that nothing can come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ.

This weekend we celebrate the Confirmation and First Communion of Elise, Narelle, Leisha and Tom at the 9am Mass. These sacraments mark the next stage of their faith journey as they are welcomed into the Catholic community of St Therese as fellow disciples of Jesus. Confirmation seals the gift of the holy Spirit they received at Baptism and sends them forth for mission, while Eucharist sustains them with physical and spiritual nourishment for the journey. Jesus challenges his disciples and us: give them something to eat yourselves. Mission to the hungry can seem enormous, but we are reminded as Christians we are with the bread of life. We have who we need in us to feed the world.

This weekend we also celebrate our Polish chaplain Fr Jozef's order – the Society of Christ Fathers' 50 years of mission here in Tasmania! What a milestone, and we share in the joy and thanksgiving of the Polish community for Fr Jozef, Fr Kaz and all who have come before them to reach out to Polish migrants who have settled here as well as their families. We are one parish hungering for Christ, enriched by the many cultures of people we have. Growing this sense of belonging comes through in the responses to question 3 on welcoming, and we will reflect on this during the homily.

POLISH NEWS 50 Lat w Służbie Bogu i polonijniej wspólnocie w Hobart

W naszej Polonijniej wspólnocie w Hobart świętujemy dziś dwie wyjątkowe okazje. Pierwszą z nich jest oczywiście 50 rocznica duszpasterskiej pracy Księży Towarzystwa Chrystusowego w Hobart.

Dokładnie 50 lat temu 2 sierpnia do Hobart przybył nieżyjący już ks. Franciszek Feruga TChr i sprawował pierwszą Mszę św. dla miejscowej wspólnoty. Pamiętamy oczywiście, że nie był to pierwszy Polski ksiądz w Hobart ponieważ wraz z żołnierzami przybywali i księża (często kapelani wojenni), którzy położyli podwaliny duszasterstwa polonijnego w naszym mieście. Jednak od chwili przybycia Kate McQuade Księży Chrystusowców przez 50 lat trwa nieprzerwana duchowa i sakramentalna posługa tych, którzy poświęcili swoje powołanie zakonne służbie Bogu w Polakach na emigracji. Nie sposób imienie wymienić wszystkich księży, którzy tu pracowali pragnę jednak wspomnieć trzech z nich, którzy poszli już po swoją nagrodę do Pana. Byli to: ks. Franciszek Feruga, ks. Stefan Koczomb i ks. Władysław Lisik. Myślę, że naszą wdzięczność za ich ofiarną pracę możemy wyrazić poprzez modlitwę w ich intencji. W każdej posłudze duszpasterskiej (chrzty, śluby, pogrzeby, niezliczone ilości Mszy świętych i spowiedzi), która dokonywała się przez ręce księży Chrystusowców niech będzie Bóg uwielbiony. Natomiast na ręce naszego obecnego duszpasterza ks. Józefa Migacza w imieniu naszej Polonijnej wspólnoty składamy serdeczne podziękowania za waszą ofiarną pracę i życzymy następnych 50 lat zabiegania o zbawienie dusz Polskich Emigrantów.

AN ENCYCLICAL LETTER ON ECOLOGY AND CLIMATE POPE FRANCIS

2020 Season of Creation Theme: Jubilee for the Earth

We are in the midst of a climate emergency. Several studies have indicated that the world is nowhere near meeting pledged emission reduction rate targets. The latest IPCC (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change) report

highlights that "only with rapid and far-reaching" transitions in the world economy, on a scale and at a rate without historical precedent, can the 1.5°C limit be achieved. It is therefore a time

to reconcile ourselves with creation through concrete repentance and urgent action. The Season of Creation is a time to acknowledge that tipping points are being reached, threatening the lives of the most vulnerable and putting the lives of future generations in jeopardy. As people of faith, we are being called to stand up against climate injustice in prophetic ways.

The Season of Creation 2020 will also be an important moment for the Christian family to raise a united voice for rapid and radical ambitious action ahead of the 26th annual United Nations Conference of the Parties (COP) to address the climate crisis. COP 26 is particularly significant, as parties are due to announce how they will implement the Paris Climate Agreement (and whether they will fall short). It is a time when faith communities are called to support and challenge their countries' leadership to implement visionary and significant goals. It is also a time when we must listen to the prophetic voices of young people.
