TO BE ON EARTH THE HEART OF GOD



Dear friends, we are on the verge of spring and we have “beach weather” this weekend to warm us up! Speaking of warmth, in the First Reading (Jer 20:7-9), the prophet Jeremiah bemoans his calling to deliver messages that people do not want to hear. Despite wanting to give up, God feels like a *‘fire burning in His Heart and imprisoned in His bones’* where he cannot walk away. In today’s Gospel (Matt 16:21-27), Jesus predicts his Passion for the first time, revealing he would suffer greatly, be killed and rise from the dead. Peter declares this must not happen and is scolded by Jesus. Moments earlier, he had called Jesus the Messiah, but he meant conquering hero, not suffering servant of God’s will. Like Jeremiah, Jesus’ message is upsetting and difficult to accept. We need open hearts and renewed minds to truly embrace God’s plan. Paul describes this in the Second Reading (Rom 12:1-2): *‘Do not conform yourself to this age, but be transformed by the renewal of your minds that you might know what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.’*

On this Social Justice Sunday, the Catholic Bishops’ Social Justice Statement for 2020–21 is titled *‘To Live Life to the Full: Mental health in Australia today.’* This statement is about each one of us: a member of my family, a work colleague, a community member, it is often the young and not so young person who we see living on the streets. In this context, renewing our minds means allowing ourselves to be transformed so that we abolish distinctions that people make; we learn to recognise and treat as brothers and sisters people we might fear, mistrust, hate, or dismiss; and we begin to look at the face of the other and see their vulnerability that calls out for presence, care, and protection.

‘Our challenge is to accompany people from the margins into a journey towards the fullness of life and love. We are meant to be in the coalface, in the messiness of it all and at the same time in fidelity to the Gospel... Like Christ in his ministry among the sick and the lost, we are called to meet God in the most unlikely people and places. We, too, must be in that frontier space.’ (Bishop Vincent Long).

ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL TO BE INTRODUCED INTO PARLIAMENT THIS WEEK

Mersey MLC Mike Gaffney will introduce a Bill that will legalise assisted suicide into the Tasmanian Legislative Council on Thursday, August 27. This Bill will make Tasmania's laws some of the most permissive in the world. The Bill does not require the person to have a terminal illness and has watered down a number of safeguards that are meant to protect vulnerable people. Please contact your local State MPs to express your concern. A letter writing kit is available at the back of the Church. Whilst handwritten letters are received better, this weekend we have prepared standard letters addressed to each of our local members of both houses of Parliament, to which you will be able to add your name, address and signature and we will post these on your behalf.

POLISH NEWS **Posłanie misyjne**

Codziennosc naszej Misjonarskiej wspolnoty co jakiś czas jest ubarwiana szczególnymi wydarzeniami. Wspominałam wam niedawno o Kapitulce Genealnej, wyborze Pzełożonej czy też uroczystych ślubach zakonnych. Dziś chciałbym podzielić się z wami kolejnym ważnym dla naszej Rodziny Zakonnej wydarzeniem, którym jest posłanie misyjne.

Każda Misjonarka Chrystusa Króla od momentu wstąpienia do Zgomadzenia przez

podejmowaną formację ludzką i duchową przygotowuje się do tego wydarzenia. Jest to moment wyjątkowy ponieważ od chwili wyjazdu za granicę Polski każda siostra nie tylko rozpoczyna pracę wśród Polonii ale też dobrowolnie staje się emigrantką i dzieli los naszych rodaków rozsianych w różnych zakątkach świata. Dziś od strony materialnej los emigranta nie jest już taki trudny jak kiedyś, chociażby po wojnie. Jednak od strony duchowej i kulturowej każdemu Polakowi towarzyszy tęsknota i nostalgia za ojczystym krajem. Te doświadczenia nie są obce naszym siostronom, które poprzez swoją posługę starają się stworzyć atmosferę rodzinnego kraju w nowej ojczyźnie.

Obrzęd posłania misyjnego odbywa się bezpośrednio przed rozpoczęciem pracy wśród Polaków poza granicami Polski. Ojciec Ignacy Posadzy założyciel naszego Zgomadzenia często powtarzał siostronom, że misję Zgomadzenia pełniemy niezależnie od tego w jakim miejscu się znajdujemy. Poprzez modlitwę i pracę mamy przyczyniać się do zbawiania dusz Polskich Emigrantów. Założyciel miał zwyczaj porównywać Misjonarkę do żołnierza w szeregach Chystusa Kóla, która modlitwą i pracą ma walczyć o duszę naszych braci. Wyjazd za granicę jest jakby rozpoczęciem tej „walki” na pierwszym froncie.

Ostatnio do pracy wśród Polonii Angielskiej została wysłana sr. Justyna Żmudzka. Obrzędu posłania misyjnego dokonał ks. Maciej Piaseczny TChr były prowincjał Towarzystwa Chrystusowego w Anglii. Jednym z elementów tego posłania jest wręczenie wyjeżdżającej siostrze wizeunku Matki Bożej Częstochowskiej, która jest patronką Polskiej Emigracji.

Polecam waszym modlitwom tę siostrę, by wiernie i z sercem pełnym miłości rozpoczęła swą misyjną posługę Polonii w Anglii.

Życzę wszystkim błogosławionego tygodnia.

LAUDATO SI'

THE TEN GREEN COMMANDMENTS

These Green Commandments have been so named and developed by Fr Joshtrom Kureethadam SDB, one of the church's experts on *Laudato Si'*.

He serves on the staff of the Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Integral Development. He lives in Rome where he has taught at Rome's Pontifical Salesian University. The first commandment is:

TAKE CARE OF OUR COMMON HOME IN PERIL

Pope Francis at the beginning of his pontificate took it upon himself to ask us to not only rebuild the 'house' of the church but a much larger one, our very common home.



What do we **SEE** today happening to this beloved home of ours?

The human impact on the environment persists because we choose to be

complacent, remain indifferent and to simply carry on as we always have.

Earth is our only home (there is no planet B). The main physical manifestations of the crisis of our common home as outlined in the encyclical of *Laudato Si'* are:

pollution and waste, climate change and its impacts, the depletion of natural resources and especially the scarcity of fresh drinking water, and the unprecedented scales of biodiversity loss.

Earth can exist without modern humans, as it has done for over 99.9% of its history. But we cannot exist without our common home. The first green commandment insists that we wake up. This is not something of the future. The time for action is now. We are called not just to acknowledge but to 'care', to act, to speak out against the forces that are destroying our planet.

The question is not what can you do but what will you do?

***May the nourishment of the earth be yours,
May the clarity of the ocean be yours,
May the protection of the ancestors be yours....***
