FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - YEAR A

FROM THE PASTOR CHRIST, COMMERCE & RE-CLAIMING THE CHARISM OF CHRISTMAS.

A friend informed me recently that one of the major department stores had begun its Christmas advertising and selling of Christmas wares by early October! Television and print advertising has rolled out a tireless campaign of promoting the consumption of Christmas gifts, and all of this is lubricated with references to and images of Santa Claus, elves and reindeer and a liberal dose of magical glitter in the images. The shops are selling Christmas cards with Season's Greetings on them, pictures of snow-men, sleighs, Santa and decorations on trees. The Australian ones have pictures of Santa wearing red shorts and thongs with a sleigh pulled by kangaroos and come to rest on a beach or at an outback fireplace by a billabong. It's playful and it's home-grown.

Yet if you want to want to present a religious Christmas card to your friends and relatives on your mailing list you need to hunt and search for a supply, as a religious theme is something of a rare, quaint curiosity to many now. Some stores will not have any religious display for fear that "it might offend" some people.

Yet the original Santa was a Christian saint who suffered for his faith in Jesus Christ during Roman persecutions. St Nicholas, the original Santa, was a Greek born 280 years after Christ who became bishop of Myra, a small Roman town in modern Turkey. Nicholas was neither fat nor jolly but developed a reputation as a fiery, wiry, and defiant defender of church doctrine during the "Great Persecution," when Bibles were put to the torch and priests made to renounce Christianity or face execution.

Nicholas defied these edicts and spent years in prison before Constantine liberated Christianity in his empire. Nicholas' fame lived long after his death (on December 6 of some unknown year in the mid-fourth century) because he was associated with many miracles, and reverence for him continues to this day independent of his Santa Claus connection.

Nicholas became known as a patron of children and magical gift bringer because of two great stories from his life. In the better-known tale, three young girls are saved from a life of prostitution when young Bishop Nicholas secretly delivers three bags of gold to their indebted father, which can be used for their dowries. The other story is not so well known now but was enormously well known in the Middle Ages. Nicholas raised three deceased children back to life. (This is abbreviated. The fuller version is quite gruesome). That's one of the things that made him the patron saint of children.

FROM THE PASTOR (CONTINUED)

From about 1200 to 1500 AD, St. Nicholas was the unchallenged bringer of gifts and the toast of celebrations centred around his day, December 6. The strict saint took on some aspects of earlier European deities, like the Roman Saturn or the Norse Odin, who appeared as white-bearded men and had magical powers like flight. He also ensured that kids toed the line by saying their prayers and practising good behaviour. And there is much more to this edited story of the evolution of Santa which you can read in

The point of writing this, though, is that Christmas today has been hijacked by secular commercialism. The birth of Christ has largely been airbrushed out of this celebration in His honour. Santa has been secularised from being the faithful Christian saint bringing gifts to liberate poor children, to being exploited to become the facilitator of first-world overindulgence in goods that we don't need. These days much public discussion is centred around the "huge boost to the economy" that is expected at Christmas, especially in the last-minute rush to the shops, and in the hyena-like descent upon the shops on "bargain" boxing day. This holiday, too, has been stolen from us to fatten the coffers of corporations. ABC journalist, Craig Reucassel, has highlighted the extraordinary, even unimaginable waste of clothing and other products that we in first-world Australia discard, in his series, *The War on Waste*. Commercial Christmas exacerbates the problem.

No-one would deny that children need to be given a gift at Christmas. It makes them feel special. It is an expression of love for them. And they feel special when they give a gift to another, too. Yet being over-indulged with too many gifts will spoil them. I saw in my own family, when the nieces and nephews were very young, the frenzy of ripping mountains of presents open with the resultant decrease in appreciation for any of them. We changed the way we adults gave them presents the following year, reducing the number, and their appreciation was healthier. Our overindulgence on ourselves corrodes our souls.

We can choose not to buy into this commercialisation of Christmas. Wouldn't we be reclaiming the true spirit of Christmas if we put the worship of Christ at the centre, and we then expressed our worship of Him in the provision of gifts and care for the most disadvantaged, the least fortunate. Imagine the joy that we would give and receive if we gifted a charity with the value of the gift that we would have received from our loved ones. We and our loved ones could agree to do this.
