Dear friends, what an amazing celebration we had of Migrant and Refugee Sunday last week! We came together as one community, celebrated the richness of the different cultural and migrant groups that make up who we are at St Therese, and challenged ourselves to grow towards an ever wider "We" in the words of Pope Francis. Some photos can be seen on the next page and a special thanks to all who contributed to the Mass and the shared lunch after.

This weekend we continue the celebrations with our parish feast day of St Therese (feast day on 1<sup>st</sup> October). In her autobiography *Story of a Soul*, Therese describes the little sacrifices and acts of love that she made for the sake of Jesus as the "Little Way", which is not about doing great things, but of small things with great love. She could do this because she saw herself as a child completely dependent on God, echoing Jesus' challenge in the gospel to be like little children to enter God's kingdom (Matt 18:1-5).

As we come to the end of this Season of Creation, it is clear we are standing at a critical crisis point where we need all hands-on deck over the next 7-10 years to help restore our planet into a nurturing home for all. A new level of consciousness demands a new level of global solidarity, and the *Laudato Si'* action platform chart a promising path forward. We planned a prayerful pilgrimage on our school/parish grounds on Sunday but the inclement weather has forced us to postpone this. We will still celebrate the blessing of animals on the school blue courts or undercover area (if wet) after the 9 am Mass on Monday 4 Oct, feast of St Francis.

The plenary council also begins this weekend (3-10 Oct). There has been plenty of criticism of the agenda and wide-ranging scepticism, but many have enormous hope for what may emerge. Significantly, the bishops will not meet alone. There will also be representatives of the clergy, vowed religious and lay representatives from every diocese. This is a huge opportunity for the Australian Church. Let us pray for its success.

## **POLISH NEWS**

## Tydzień modlitw za migrantów i uchodźców

W ostatnią niedzielę 26 września 2021 r., w Kościele Katolickim rozpoczął się tydzień modlitw w intencji migrantów i uchodźców. Stało się już tradycją, że centralne obchody tego święta przypadają na ostatnią niedzielę września. Tegoroczny Światowy Dzień Migrantów i Uchodźców był już sto siódmym. Jego obchody są zachętą do naszej modlitwy i zainteresowania duszpasterskiego osobami z różnych powodów zmieniającymi swoje zamieszkanie i poszukującymi nowej ojczyzny. Wśród nich są wypędzeni, uchodźcy i przymusowo przesiedleni na skutek wojen, prześladowań, głodu i coraz częściej zmian klimatycznych. Do tej grupy zaliczamy się również my - Polacy, którzy na skutek II Wojny Światowej, prześladowań komunistycznych czy też w poszukiwaniu lepszego jutra wyemigrowaliśmy z Polski i znaleźliśmu swoją nową ojczyznę w Australii.

Jak co roku Ojciec Święty Franciszek przygotował na ten dzień Orędzie, które nosi tytuł: "Ku stale rosnącemu my". W swoim orędziu skierował do nas następujące słowa: "Do wszystkich mężczyzn i kobiet na świecie kieruję mój apel, abyśmy (...) odbudowali rodzinę kudzką, by razem tworzyć naszą przyszłość, sprawiedliwości i pokoju, upewniając się, że nikt nie zostanie wykluczony. (...) jeśli tylko tego chcemy, możemy przekształcić granice w uprzywilejowane miejsca spotkania, gdzie może rozkwitnąć cud coraz większego my".

Z tej okazji w nszej parafi pod wezwaniem św. Teresy została przygotowana tzw. Muliculural Mass, która miała połączyć ludzi wielu narodowości i kultur na wspólnej modlitwie do naszego Pana. W ten sposób mogliśmy zobaczyć, że w św. Teresie modlą się nie tylko Australijczycy i Polacy ale też wiele osób innych narodowości. Różnimy się od siebie kulturą, językiem, tradycjami

wyniesionymi z ojczystego kraju ale co ważniejsze mamy jedno co nas wszystkich łączy w jedną społeczność – wiarę. Łączy nas Bóg, do którego choć różnymi jezykami wspólnie zanosimy nasze modlitwy. Łączy nas również los migrantów, którzy opuszczających swoją ojczyznę i poszukujących nowego domu w Australi.

Myślę, że w naszej Polonijnej wspólnocie ten dzień spotkał się z ogromnym niezrozumieniem. Pojawiły się krytyczne głosy, dlaczego nie możemy mieć Mszy po polsku? Niektórzy na znak protesu w kościele się wogóle nie pojawili. Kochani, my wszyscy mieszkający w Australii jesteśmy emigrantami i to jest dla nas wyjątkowy dzień, nasze święto! Pamiętajmy, że my Polacy nie stanowimy odrębnej jednostki, jesteśmy częścią powszechnego Kościoła i nie ma czegoś takiego jak polski kościół w Australii (natomiast dziękujmy Bogu za to, że mamy polskiego duszpasterza i możemy modlić się w swoim ojczystym języku). Wyrażam głęboką nadzieję, że weźmiemy sobie do serca słowa naszego Papieża Franciszka i w przyszłym roku na wielokulturowej Mszy Polska Wsólnota będzie reprezentowana przez liczniejsze grono naszych przedstawicieli.
