Dear friends, as we start to warm up in the summer months (the second day of summer that dumped snow in parts of Tasmania not withstanding!), we are reminded of the call to prepare for the coming of Jesus in a new way this Advent. There is no limit to the ways in which God is present, and for that reason, every juncture of our lives can be a place of encounter with the divine. The spiritual writer Jan Richardson reflects: "the season of Advent means there is something on the horizon the likes of which we have never seen before. It is not possible to keep it from coming...What is possible is not to see it, to miss it, to turn just as it brushes past you."

The readings for the Second Sunday of Advent highlight prophets as people who can guide us on this journey. In the First Reading (Isaiah 40:1-11), the prophet addressed the people of Judah, many of whom lived away from their homeland in exile, to prepare the way for God to offer comfort and assurance to them in their return home. The Gospel (Mark 1:1-8) picks up on the language of preparing the way by connecting it with John the Baptist and his role in heralding the arrival of the Messiah. With echoes from Isaiah, people are invited from throughout Jerusalem and the Judean countryside to go into the wilderness and visit

the prophet and be baptised.

The current global pandemic can feel like a desert where all of us have experienced varying degrees of loss. Our assumed certainty about the future, our routines and patterns we clung to have fallen through our hands like sand. Like the Jewish people in exile, our wilderness is marked by confusion, uncertainty, fear, pain, suffering, death. Yet our faith insists this is the moment where we can cry out with hope: 'Prepare the way of the Lord! Here is our God! Here comes our salvation!' But it will require that we also go into this desert. We must enter the bewildering silence and unfamiliar territory to listen. A tough gig in this season of rushing, worrying and pushing even!

The candle of peace we light this weekend is a timely reminder to pause. *Stay. Sit. Linger. Tarry. Ponder, Wait. Behold. Wonder*. To make this time of bewildering silence a holy silence instead, one in which we can hear God speak words to us of comfort, tenderness and hope, one to allow God to level our 'mountains' of pride, anger and envy and fill in the 'valleys' of shame, guilt and fear.

Martin Manor has had a rich history over the years as a school and parish office, and in recent times, a presbytery and place of residence. Its size confounds all who have stayed here, especially in winter, but when it warms up with the glow of sunshine and the chatter of community, there are few better places in which to meet and chill. I present you some of those moments of gathering that inspired life in the manor, thanks to the Parish Strategy & Support group, Lay MSC's, and Craft group.

They were among about 125 parishioners, religious and priests from Southern Tasmania who considered the topic of "Sharing the Journey: Co-Responsibility in Our Church". Similar gatherings were being held in the North and North-west. A presentation was made focusing on the report *The Light from* the Southern Cross – Promoting **Co-Responsible Governance in the Catholic** Church in Australia, which had been commissioned by the Australian Catholic **Bishops Conference and Catholic Religious** Australia. Then followed animated discussion in table groups on Leadership, Co-responsibility and Issues of Power and Abuse of Power in our Church. Parishioners commented on how valuable it was to come together with others committed to re-vitalising the Church as the People of God. POLISH NEWS Polak Biskupem w Australii Na początku sierpnia Papież Franciszek nominował ks. Karola Kulczyckiego nowym biskupem w Australii. Jego duszpasterskiej

opiece została powierzona Diecezja Port Pirie w Południowej Australii.

Ksiądz Karol Kulczycki należy do Zgromadzenia zakonnego Towarzystwo Boskiego Zbawiciela popularnie zwane Salwatorianami i od 1997 roku pracował w Zachodniej Australii. W 2018 roku został mianowany wieceprowincjałem polskiej prowincji Salwatorianów i w związku z tym powrócił do Polski. 823 km2 (dla porównania powierzchnia Polski wynosi 322 575 km2). Diecezja została kanonicznie erygowana przez papieża Leona XIII w dniu 10 maja 1887 r. i nosiła nazwę od jej stolicy, którą było miasto Port Augusta. W dniu 5 sierpnia 1951 r. siedziba diecezji została przeniesiona z Port Augusta do Port Pirie, zmieniła się też wtedy nazwa diecezji. Obecnie głównym kościołem jest katedra św. Marka w Port Pirie.

Ks. Karol Kulczycki SDS, ur. 19. 10. 1966 r. w Górze (woj. Dolnośląskie). W okresie dzieciństwa i młodości mieszkał w Czerninie. W 1987 r. wstąpił do nowicjatu Towarzystwa Boskiego Zbawiciela w Bagnie koło Wrocławia, gdzie podjął studia filozoficzno-teologiczne, które zakończył obroną pracy magisterskiej. 28 maja 1994 r. w Sanktuarium Matki Bożej Fatimskiej w Trzebini otrzymał święcenia kapłańskie z rąk Jego Eminencji Kardynała Franciszka Macharskiego. W latach 1994-1997 posługiwał w Salwatoriańskim Ośrodku Powołań, a w 1996 r. został dyrektorem tego Ośrodka. W 1997 r. otrzymał zgodę władz zakonnych, aby kontynuować swoją posługę kapłańską i zakonną we wspólnocie Salwatorianów w Australii. W 2018 r. został wybrany wikariuszem prowincjalnym Prowincji Polskiej Towarzystwa Boskiego Zbawiciela i powrócił do Polski.

Podobnie jak święcenia kapłańskie, ks. Kulczycki przyjął święcenia biskupie w Trzebinii. Święceń biskupich ks. Karolowi Kulczyckiemu udzielił ks. abp Adolfo Tito Yllana, nuncjusz apostolski w Australii.

Diecezja Port Pirie wchodzi w skład metropolii Adelaide i pod względem wielkości geograficznej diecezja Port Pirie jest trzecią co do wielkości diecezją Australii. Diecezja ma powierzchnię 978 Nominacja biskupia ks. Karola jest wyróżnieniem ale też ogromnym zadaniem dlatego polecam waszej pamięci modlitewnej naszego rodaka dzielącego z nami losy emigranta, by z gorliwością pełnił powierzoną mu posługę.
