Dear friends, Anti-Poverty Week (11-17 Oct) is a time for increasing our understanding of poverty in Australia and taking action collectively to end it. This year the focus is on supporting affordable housing for all as the best way to reduce poverty and campaigning against unemployment payments going back to \$40 a day, which traps people in extreme poverty, unable to eat properly or pay their housing, medical and other basic expenses. In the same spirit of working to end poverty, we will have a video appeal this weekend by Fr. Roger Purcell for MSC Missions that provide development and relief programmes for projects involving clean water, disadvantaged youth and HIV/Aids support in poor village communities. We thank you in advance for your generous response.

In today's Gospel (Matt 22:15-21) we hear the well-known passage that is sometimes used to justify paying taxes or to advocate for a separation of church and state, which is not Matthew's intention. The Pharisees plotted against Jesus, asking him whether it is lawful to pay taxes to the emperor. If Jesus said people should not pay the tax, this would anger the Herodians, supporters of Herod Antipas, since Herod's power depended on his relationship to the Roman emperor. If he said people should pay the tax, zealots who opposed Roman occupation would be angry with him. Jesus carefully sidesteps this trap by asking them whose image and inscription are on the coin used to pay the tax. The coin they presented likely bore the image of Tiberius Caesar, who ruled during Jesus' adult life. Jesus then declares, "Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

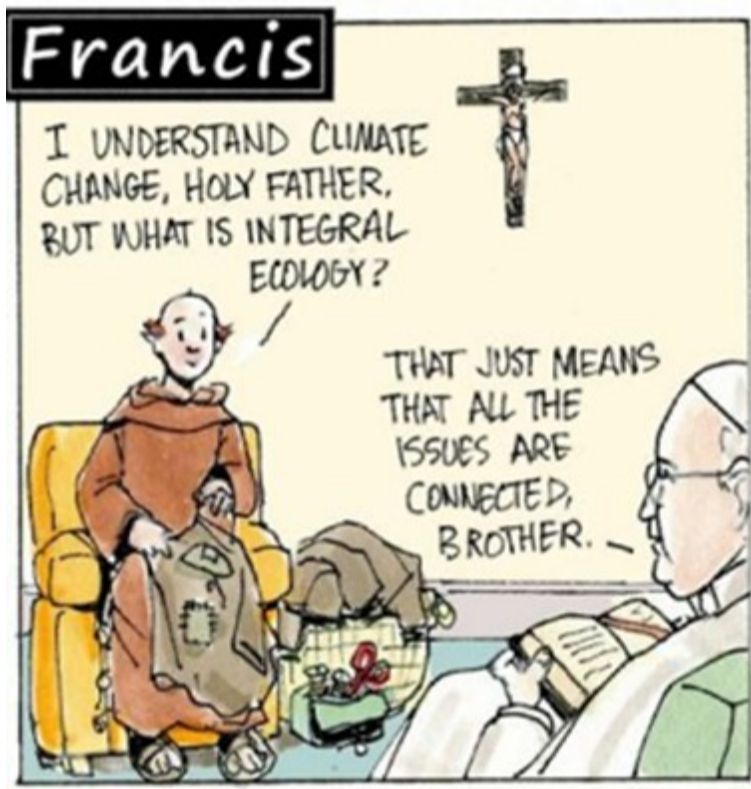
In the first part of this response, Jesus affirms the money is issued from the emperor, so giving a portion as a tax is merely returning the money to its owner, a thoughtful response that likely would not anger those who were pro- or anti-tax. But Jesus also adds a second, more challenging response: the importance of giving to God what belongs to God. Since life

comes from God, in whose image and likeness all of us, rich and poor alike are made, Jesus also reminds us of the need to devote our actions and lives to God, and to our brothers and sisters who need our help. Who are the Caesars that we attach ourselves to, and do we sometimes give to them what we should give to God?

We continue to break open *Laudato Si'* by drawing on the wisdom of Fr Joshtrom in his latest book *'The Ten Green Commandments'*. The **sixth** commandment begins the third step of **'Acting': Responding to the Crisis of Our Common Home**.

## 6. Develop an Integral Ecology

This is seen by many commentators as one of the most original contributions of the encyclical. 'We are all connected' is the mantra that is repeated throughout the document.



We are connected to the rest of the human family, to the created world and to those who will come after us in future generations. Genuine care for our own lives and our relationships with nature is inseparable from fraternity, justice and faithfulness to others.

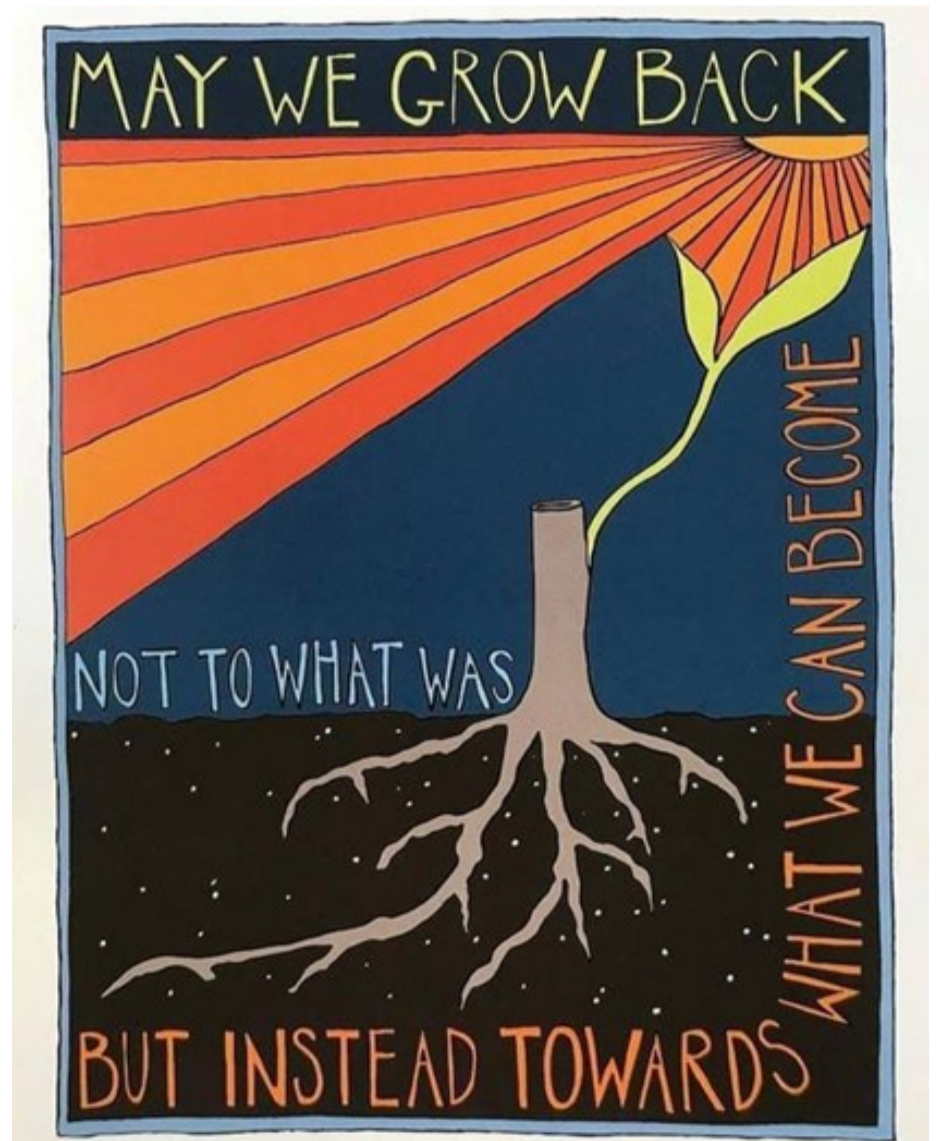
Together we form a kind of universal family. Created according to the divine model, the world is a web of relationships. Pope Francis talks about the imbalance that has been engendered in the past. For example, people caring about the plight of exotic species while being callous about people dying of hunger. What is needed is a unitary vision and approach.

A society deaf to the cry of the poor will also be equally deaf to the cry of the Mother Earth. When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the inherent worth of a poor person, a human embryo, a person with disability etc., it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself.

The Pope sees St Francis of Assisi as the model of integral ecology. His triple loves for creation, for the poor and for the Creator merged into a sublime unity. We are called to grow in the same way.

### **SAFE COMMUNITIES PARISH AUDIT**

Safe Communities is a Framework and is an initiative of the Archdiocese of Hobart to protect children and vulnerable adults from abuse and neglect. The Framework requires the involvement of everyone in the Catholic Church within the Archdiocese. This Framework has been developed to ensure compliance with the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

As part of this Framework volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy are required to have a current police check and Working with Vulnerable Persons check.

To ensure that the Parish is compliant for the Audit in November 2020, the list of volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy is required to hold the required checks. Failure to obtain these required checks will result in

the volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy, not being able to undertake their ministry.
