Dear friends, this weekend we celebrate the feast of All Saints. Since the solemnity falls on a Sunday this year, we hear the Lectionary readings assigned for the feast rather than for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our Gospel, like Moses' ascent of Mount Sinai to receive the law, Jesus ascends a mountain to teach the disciples in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt 5:1-12). We call His teaching 'The Beatitudes' because Jesus highlights multiple groups who are unexpectedly blessed—people who are: 1) poor in spirit, 2) gentle, 3) mourning, 4) hungry and thirsty for what is right, 5) merciful, 6) pure in heart, 7) peacemakers and 8) persecuted in the cause of right and insulted.

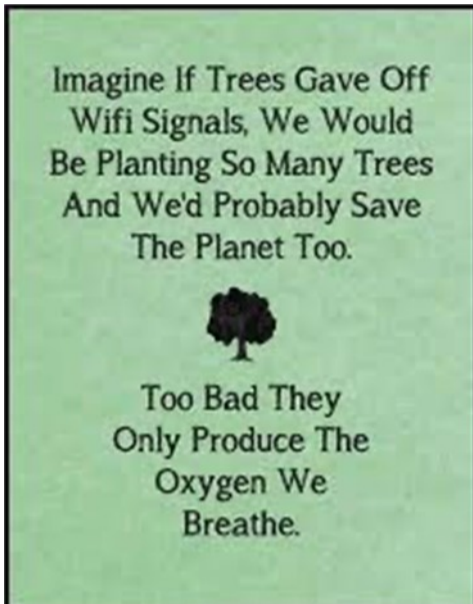
The dual blessing and comfort of each Beatitude responds to the challenges faced by Matthew's community and acknowledges the expectation of future rewards. But the Beatitudes can also be read with an eye to the present. The groups that are highlighted show characteristics that we should aspire to have today. These statements are about how people live, even in the face of adversity; and they remind us that actions, not only words, reveal faith in Christ. This is important because we do not celebrate an elite group of people who lived extraordinary lives which set them apart from the many, but ordinary people like us and the transformation that is possible in our lives and our world.

We Catholics love to venerate our saints, and when we do that without giving in to superstition, we are saying it is humanly possible for us to be like Christ. Christ continues to be born anew in every place and time, in the hearts of men and women who have chosen to conform their lives to his in doing the Father's will and yet be utterly diverse in how they do it. Every saint has a different story to tell, and every saint shows us how it is possible to be another Christ in our world. These are the famous saints recognised by the Church, as well as the people who come into our lives and make a difference, known only to us. They may not have been people we expect, like the good Samaritan. We meet them in school, on our streets, in church, in trains, in shops or around a meal. In reflecting on the lives of these saints, we are also called to be saints, to live as Christ did.

The Green Commandments of 'Acting': Responding to the Crisis of Our Common Home.

8. Educate towards an Ecological Citizenship

Many are caught up in needless buying and spending. In the case of natural resources like fisheries, forests, biodiversity and fresh water, we are fast approaching crucial thresholds. Currently as a whole, we consume or over-consume 1.5 planets a year. Ours is a throw-away culture.



In most textbooks, Earth is represented more as a source of natural resources for human consumption rather than a home that hosts and sustains humanity along with other forms of life. We need a radical new lifestyle if we are to save our common planetary home for ourselves and future generations.

Pope Francis proposes a holistic model of ecological education in schools, families, media, catechesis and houses of religious formation, capable of re-establishing harmony with nature, with others and with God:

- (1). Assist students to become responsible members of the wider human community and citizens of the biotic community. Simple but valuable practices include: avoiding use of plastic and paper, reducing water consumption, separating refuse, showing care for other living beings, using public transport, carpooling, planting trees, turning off unnecessary lights.
- (2). Help our young people to be loving and kind and to perform small daily acts of solidarity.
- (3). Inculcate a profound sense of the awareness of the presence of God in the natural world and in the lives of people.

Fortunately, many young people are increasingly showing the way to care for our common planetary home. I found this out in the recent webinar when I participated on a conversation panel with young adult leaders from our MSC schools and parishes around Australia. They spoke passionately and eloquently on this global issue, and a significant outcome was our schools being invited on to a pilot project (*Laudato Si'* 7-year action platform) from the Vatican Dicastery for Integral Development.

I was really pumped and inspired after the webinar - the best one I have been part of! You can catch this recorded webinar on

Od nagłej i niespodziewanej śmierci - zachowaj nas Panie

Po jednym z ostatnich pogrzebów w naszej polonijnej wspólnotce zostałam przez kogoś zapytana. Siostró, jak to jest, że w suplikacji modlimy się „od nagłej i niespodziewanej śmierci zachowaj nas Panie”, a ta pani zmarła tak nagle, przecież jeszcze kilka dni temu wiedzieliśmy ją w kościele, a tu się okazuje, że tak nagle zmarła. Jak to jest, czy Pan Bóg nie wysłuchuje naszych modlitw?

Myślę, że jest to dobre pytanie i wartoby się nad nim chwilę zatrzymać. Zwróćmy uwagę, że jako ludzie wierzący wszyscy oczekujemy ponownego przyjścia Chrystusa czyli tzw. Paruzji. Mamy świadomość, że nasz pobyt tu na ziemi jest przejściowy i prędzej, czy później każdy z nas przez bramę śmierci będzie musiał przejść. Ponieważ tylko śmierć doczesnego ciała prowadzi nas do nieba (bram życia wiecznego).

W Ewangelii wg św. Łukasza czytamy: „Wy też bądźcie gotowi, gdyż o godzinie, której się nie domyślacie, Syn Człowieczy przyjdzie”. Słowa te dają nam do zrozumienia, że dzień i godzina śmierci nie są nam zname i pozostają dla

wszystkim tajemnicą. Nie jest to oczywiście powód do trwania w strachu lecz zachęta do tego, by być gotowym na spotkanie z Jezusem. Czyli każdy z nas powinien spodziewać się śmierci i być do niej przygotowany.

Na czym polega ta gotowość? Myślę, że najważniejszym elementem gotowości powinno być trwanie w stanie łaski uświęcającej czyli bez grzechu ciężkiego. Często w naszym zabieganym życiu odkładamy spowiedź na wyjątkowe uroczystości zamiast korzystać z niej regularnie. W relacjach do ludzi, niektóre osoby całymi latami trwają w gniewie i nie chcą się pojednać. A św. Paweł mówi wyraźnie „niech nad waszym gniewem nie zachodzi słońce”. Skąd możemy mieć pewność, że następnego dnia rano się obudzimy? Już dziś mamy obowiązek pojednać się z naszym bliskim.

To co naprawdę mamy, to jest dzień dzisiejszy, byśmy mogli pojednać się z Bogiem, pojednać się z ludźmi, naprawić wyrządzone krzywdy, wyjaśnić pogmatwane sprawy. Jutro może nie nadejść ale dzisiaj mamy jeszcze szansę, to wszystko naprawić.

Kiedy więc modlimy się słowami „od nagłej i niespodziewanej śmierci, zachowaj nas Panie” nie mamy na myśli czasu, bo śmierć zawsze przychodzi nagle, ale mamy na myśli stan naszej duchowej gotowości na spotkanie z Bogiem. Kiedy przyjdzie godzina naszej śmierci nie będziemy mogli powiedzieć, Panie Jezu poczekaj, bo ja jeszcze muszę pogodzić się z moim bratem, wtedy nie będzie już na to czasu. Jeśli będziemy mieli załatwione wszystkie te sprawy, to godzina naszego odejścia z tego świata nigdy nie będzie niepodziewana. Kiedy Jezus przyjdzie będziemy gotowi pójść za Nim niezależnie od tego w jakim momencie naszego życia do nas przyjdzie. Takiej postawy życzę sobie i wszystkim, którzy oczekują na ponowne przyjście Chrystusa.

SAFE COMMUNITIES PARISH AUDIT

Safe Communities is a Framework and is an initiative of the Archdiocese of Hobart to protect children and vulnerable adults from abuse and neglect. The Framework requires the involvement of everyone in the Catholic Church within the Archdiocese. This Framework has been developed to ensure compliance with the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

As part of this Framework volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy are required to have a current police check and Working with Vulnerable Persons check.

To ensure that the Parish is compliant for the Audit in November 2020, the list of volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy is required to hold the required checks. Failure to obtain these required checks will result in the volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy, not being able to undertake their ministry.

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: (Cf. Psalm 87:3)

Let my prayer come into your presence.
Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.
