Dear friends, today's Readings lie at the heart of our vocation as Christians. In the First Reading (Exod 22:20-26), the Israelites were traveling through the wilderness toward the promised land after their exodus from Egypt. Through Moses, they received God's laws, first the Ten Commandments and then hundreds of additional laws. This Reading highlights groups who are most vulnerable and susceptible to abuse: strangers or foreigners, widows and orphans. Laws were enacted to protect these marginalised people. The text highlights the importance of empathy and memory. The Israelites were to care for the foreigners in their midst, motivated by their own recollection of suffering, "for you were once aliens yourselves in the land of Egypt."

In the Gospel (Matt 22:34-40), Jesus is confronted with another test by the Pharisees. A lawyer in their group asks Jesus which Commandment is the greatest, and Jesus responds with a paraphrase of two laws: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is a partial quote of the Shema Yisrael ("Hear, O Israel"), a Jewish prayer that affirms the oneness of God and the importance of faithful worship to God (see Deut 6:4-5). Jesus adds, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself," a partial quote of Lev 19:18. Arguably, today's Gospel has one of the most important teachings of Jesus. He draws on his Jewish heritage to affirm tradition and emphasises the importance of love as the spirit behind all the laws and commands.

Love in these readings mean sincere commitment to God through actions in service to God and each other. There are tangible things that can be done to show love. Love is implementing policies that protect the vulnerable. Love is treating all human beings as neighbours, not just those who look like us. Love is fighting for the whole spectrum of life: the unborn, the vulnerable, the terminally ill.

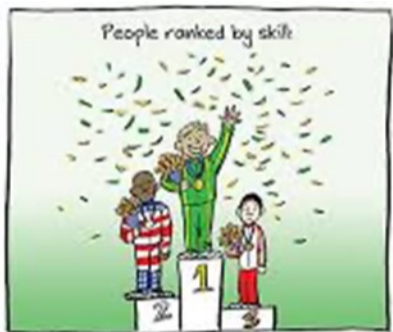
In *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis' new encyclical, we are reminded again of how everything is connected. "To care for the world in which we live means to care for ourselves." (FT 17).

## **The Green Commandments of 'Acting': Responding to the Crisis of Our Common Home.**

### **7. Learn A New Way of Dwelling in Our Common Home**

A new way of living in our world is called for. The crisis is global so the dedication and involvement of the entire human community is needed to protect the earth. Each of us can co-operate as instruments of God for the care of creation, each according to his/her own culture, experience, involvement, talents. The Pope calls for richer countries to do more to ensure that the problems they have caused are addressed and that they in turn can assist poorer countries.

We need a new economy. If you look at the etymological meaning of the term economics, it



comes from ***oikos + nomos*** which is the rule or law of one's household. So, in today's context economics needs to be reinterpreted as the art and science of managing our common planetary home.

The overarching belief that guides modern economic capitalism is that nature is merely a storehouse of resources to be utilised for human consumption. The current economic system largely excludes the poor and vulnerable. While many are getting richer more are getting poorer. This is based on the lie that there is an infinite supply of earth's goods, and this leads to the planet being squeezed dry.

Pope Francis calls for a new political culture that is not subservient to economic interests but sees the situation of the poor – for humanity and the earth - and works to bring a balance to all creation. This is the love we are all called to in the Gospel.

*Spirit of Justice, break open our hearts. Break them wide open.  
Let anger pour through like strong winds, cleaning us of complacency.  
Let courage pour through like spring storms, flooding out fear.  
Let zeal pour through like blazing summer sun, filling us with passion.  
Force of Justice, grant me anger at what is,  
courage to do what must be done, passion to break down the walls of injustice  
and build a land flowing with milk and honey for God's beloved,  
God's special love, God's Poor Ones.  
Spirit of Justice break open our hearts.*

## **SAFE COMMUNITIES PARISH AUDIT**

Safe Communities is a Framework and is an initiative of the Archdiocese of Hobart to protect children and vulnerable adults from abuse and neglect. The Framework requires the involvement of everyone in the Catholic Church within the Archdiocese. This Framework has been developed to ensure compliance with the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

As part of this Framework volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy are required to have a current police check and Working with Vulnerable Persons check.

To ensure that the Parish is compliant for the Audit in November 2020, the list of volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy is required to hold the required checks. Failure to obtain these required checks will result in the volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy, not being able to undertake their ministry.

The Parish will contribute to your Police Check and Working with Vulnerable Persons Checks. Either via reimbursement or through the direct payment of these checks. The Parish is able to assist all volunteers, staff, religious and Clergy to complete the necessary applications for these checks.
